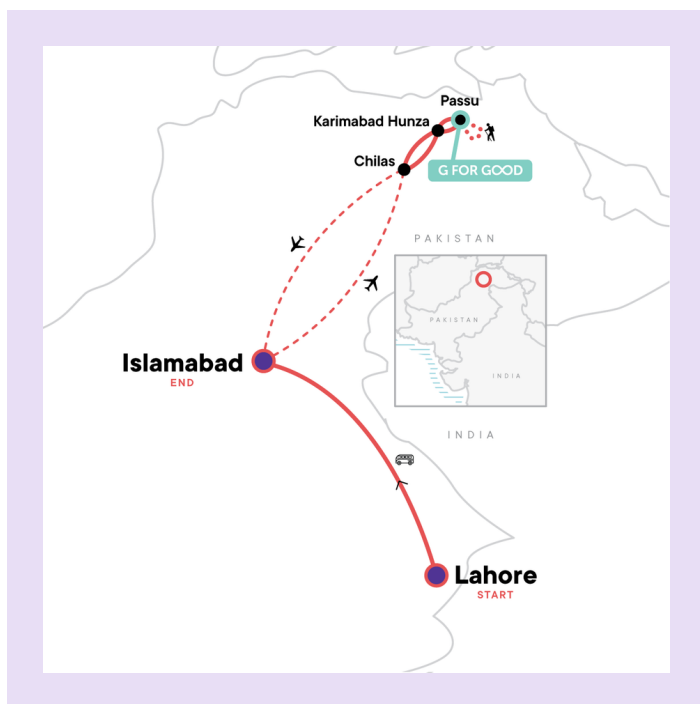

Lahore

Wagah Border Ceremony

Wāgah

Every evening, thousands of people gather to watch the famous parade and the ceremonial lowering of their national flags by the Indian and Pakistani armies at sunset. Witness this event in the stands and cheer on as the two countries showcase their national pride. This vibrant ceremony symbolizes the long-standing rivalry between the two nations, making it a significant cultural and historical landmark

ACTIVITY

Visit the popular Food Street in the historic Haveli Khalil Khan, on the Fort Road Food Street. Dig into a delicious meal while overlooking the Badshahi Mosque.

Drive towards Islamabad this morning after filling up on breakfast. On the way, we'll stop at the Chakwal Canyon for a local farming experience, where we'll help pick fresh produce alongside our local guides. We sit down together for a delicious BBQ lunch. Before heading off, jump into a trolley for a tour of the incredible Chakwal Canyon. Continue the scenic drive along the Punjab countryside and check into the hotel once we arrive in Islamabad. Spend evening free in the city to explore the bustling life of Islamabad.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Head to Passu for the day, known for its beautiful landscapes and glaciers, and stop at Attabad Lake for a photo stop along the way. This morning, we'll visit the Korgah Carpet Center, a local initiative created by five local women looking to improve the quality of their own lives and those of their community. The center aims to empower women in Hunza through traditional carpet weaving. Then visit the Gulmit Old House, renowned for its intricately carved doors and windows. Enjoy lunch at the Old House, a restaurant ran by local women supporting their families. On the way to Passu Glacier, stop at Borith Lake in hopes to see some migratory birds in this sanctuary. Drive from Borith Lake to Passu and start the hike up to the glacier. We'll even have a chance to walk on the pristine ice of the glacier. After working up a massive appetite, join your CEO at the Food Pavilion, a local restaurant led by Lal Shehzadi, a local female entrepreneur who has served as a local inspiration to fellow women to embark on opening their own restaurants and local establishments.

Borith Lake Visit

Passu

Borith Lake is renowned for its migratory birds and serves as a sanctuary for various wildfowl, attracting birdwatchers and nature enthusiasts. Spend some free time exploring this beautiful place.

Passu Glacier Hike

Passu

Hike to the renowned Passu Glacier, which begins after a 10-minute drive from Borith Lake. The initial five minutes of the hike are steep, followed by a relatively flat section leading to the glacier. To experience walking on the glacier, we'll descend onto the moraine and walk on the pristine ice. Take your time to relax and appreciate the natural beauty surrounding you.

ACTIVITY

Enjoy lunch at Old House, a charming local restaurant run by a woman who serves delicious regional cuisine. All the staff are local women supporting their families. The food is fantastic, and you'll love the authentic atmosphere in this welcoming setting

ACTIVITY

Enjoy a guided tour of Gulmit Old House, renowned for its intricately carved doors and windows. Over six centuries old, it showcases the heritage of the Gojal Valley, where most residents speak Wakhi and belong to the Shia Ismaili sect. The house features ancient artifacts, including bronze utensils and traditional clothing, displayed in a museum on the ground floor. The double-story structure is built from stone, mud, and wood, reflecting the region's rich cultural history. The renovation of the house was funded by the woman-owned Old House Cafe, and the Old House was in fact the owners family home before serving as an important piece of Pakistani cultural heritage.

ACTIVITY

Visit the Korgah Carpet Centre, which aims to empower women in Hunza through traditional carpet weaving. Located in a 400-year-old Wakhi house, the centre features engraved wooden pillars, a bukhari stove for heating and cooking and floors covered in yak hair sharmas. Engage with the women entrepreneurs working there, who will share their inspiring stories. Experience the process of making traditional woolen caps, where everyone can try on caps and adjust them to fit their heads perfectly and keep the cap you create as a memorable keepsake.

Upon reaching the fort, you may opt to purchase a ticket for a guided tour or explore independently, capturing artistic photographs of the breathtaking scenery. In the evening, consider joining your CEO for dinner at the Karimabad Bazaar.

Karimabad

Hike to the Baltit fort from Karimabad Bazaar, a 20-minute walk through charming old settlements and handicraft shops. The fort offers stunning views of the valley and Khun (settlement). If you're interested, you can opt for a guided tour of the fort by purchasing tickets on-site.

Jeep Safari to Kho Meadows

Spend the day on an epic adventure to the picturesque Koh Meadows. Ride a jeep through the beautiful landscapes and enjoy lunch under the snow capped mountains.

Day 8

Karimabad Hunza

Feel transported back in time with a guided tour of the Ganish Settlement, the earliest settlement along the historic Silk Road. Discover its 400-year-old mosques and ancient watchtowers, rich with history and cultural significance. After the tour, drive to Hooper Valley and choose between an easy and a more challenging hike. The easy 20 minute hikes brings you to a beautiful lookout point of the glacier and allows time to relax in this beautiful place. Or choose to do the longer 2 hour hike that allows you to walk on the glacier.

Hopper Valley Glacier Hike

Karimabad

Visit Hopper Valley, renowned for its stunning glaciers and beautiful peaks including the Golden Peak and Hopper Glacier. The valley serves as a base camp for treks into the Hispar Muztagh range and is home to Rush Lake, one of the highest alpine lakes in the world.

Choose between two hikes: a scenic 2-hour round trek to Hopper Glacier or a short 20-minute walk to a viewpoint. For the glacier hike, you will descend a steep section, walk on the glacier, and enjoy some leisure time before hiking back to the starting point.

Ganish Settlement Tour

Karimabad

Visit the ancient Ganish settlement on a guided tour that takes you back in time. Derived from the Burushaski word "Genish," meaning gold, Ganish boasts four 300-400-year-old mosques, recognized with a UNESCO Heritage Award in 2002, showcasing its architectural and cultural significance. Serving as one of the original overnight stops on the Silk Road, the settlement is steeped in history and has an incredible story to tell.

Day 9

Karimabad Hunza/ Gilgit

Visit a local host family for the day in Khanabad. Connect with the locals and learn about their daily way of life while cooking a traditional meal. Explore the village with your local hosts, the highlight being the Youth Garden, a local tree plantation project with over 50,000 trees planted by local youth. After the visit, drive to Gilgit and check into our hotel for the night.

Visit Khanabad Village and receive a traditional welcome by the host family upon arrival. Join our village guide on a walk through the village, sharing insights about their home. Visit the water flour mill, water distribution channel, and the Youth Garden, a tree plantation project with over 50,000 trees planted by local youth. You'll interact with locals, hear stories from the host family, and enjoy a traditional lunch, offering an authentic glimpse into the village's culture and hospitality.

Head to the Dharmarajika Stupa, an important Buddhist monastic complex that makes up part of the Taxila ruins. Then visit the Taxila Museum and the collection of ancient artifacts from the historic Taxila Ruins. In the evening, enjoy one last meal together to reflect on an amazing adventure in Pakistan.

Taxila Museum

Taxila

Visit the Taxila Museum, which houses an extensive collection of Gandharan art. Most artifacts were excavated from the ancient ruins of Taxila, dating back to 600-700 BCE. The museum, opened in 1928, displays over 4,000 objects, including sculptures, coins, and relics representing Buddhist, Hindu, and Jain traditions.

Taxila Truck Art

Taxila

Visit the renowned Truck Art workshops and engage with the local artists. Watch the artists at work, creating vibrant and intricate designs. Meet the shopkeepers as they craft beautiful truck art stickers and explore their souvenir shops. Then sit down for a cup of tea served in a traditional truck art-themed setting.

Dharmarajika Stupa

Taxila

Visit Dharmarajika Stupa, one of the most significant Buddhist relics in South Asia. Built in the 3rd century BCE during the Mauryan Empire by Emperor Ashoka, it was constructed to enshrine relics of the Buddha. The stupa is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site at Taxila, a major center of Buddhist learning. Dharmarajika's structure includes a large hemispherical dome and surrounding shrines, symbolizing peace and reverence in Buddhist architecture and tradition.

Aboard expedition trips visits to research stations depend on final permission.

Are there Itinerary notes?

Please note that the arrival hotel check in time is 2:00 pm onward. If you wish to have your room available earlier, we recommend booking a pre-night.

What is the group leader like?

This G Adventures group trip is accompanied by one of our group leaders, otherwise known as a Chief Experience Officer (CEO). The aim of the group leader is to take the hassle out of your travels and to help you have the best trip possible. They will provide information on the places you are travelling through, offer suggestions for things to do and see, recommend great local eating venues and introduce you to our local friends. While not being guides in the traditional sense you can expect them to have a broad general knowledge of the countries visited on the trip, including historical, cultural, religious and social aspects.

We also use local guides where we think more specific knowledge will add to the enjoyment of the places we are visiting - we think it's the best of both worlds.

For details of your joining hotel please refer to your tour voucher, G Account, the G Adventures App or contact your travel agent.

An arrival transfer is included when you arrive on Day 1, or when you arrive up to three days prior to the tour, provided that you have booked your pre-accommodation through G Adventures in our joining hotel. Due to customer experience and quality considerations, all services related to the tour must be continuous.

Our G Adventures representative will be at the airport to meet you. Our representative will stand at the meeting area of all travel/hotel representatives. It is located approximately 50 meters from the exit doors after luggage check. Our transfer representative will be waiting for you with a G Adventures sign board in hand. If for any reason you are not met at the airport, please call our local support line. If you are unable to make contact for whatever reason, please make your way to the joining point hotel via taxi.

Please note that day 1 is an arrival day and no activities have been planned on this day.

Upon arrival to your Joining Hotel (note that check-in time will be in the afternoon), look for a note or bulletin board in the reception with a note from your CEO. This note will give the details of your Welcome Meeting on day 1 (usually between 5pm and 7pm), where you will get a chance to meet your CEO and other travellers, as well as learn more about how the tour will run. If you don't see a note, please ask reception for details!

If you are arriving later and will miss the Welcome Meeting, your CEO will leave a note at reception for you with any information you may need, and with morning instructions for the next day.

Who should I contact in case of an emergency?

What are the visas and entry requirements for my trip?

All countries require a valid passport (with a minimum 6 months validity). Contact your local embassy or consulate for the most up-to-date visa requirements, or see your travel agent. It is your own responsibility to have the correct travel documentation. Visa requirements for your trip will vary depending on where you are from and where you are going. We keep the following information up to date as far as possible, but rules do change and sometimes without warning. While we provide the following information in good faith, it is vital that you check the information yourself and understand that you are fully responsible for your own visa requirements.

We recommend travellers apply for their visa to visit Pakistan 2-3 months prior to departure. If your nationality is applicable to apply for an E-Visa, please apply [here](#)

VISA INFORMATION:

Please use the start hotel of your tour as a reference for your visa application. Contact us or your travel agent if you need further information.

Please note, when applying for your Pakistan visa, you must declare the following:

- Any recent travel to/from India
- Any dual nationality relating to India
- Any family members of Indian heritage

This may lead to a more thorough review of your visa application where further documentation may be required by the embassy.

What should I consider when planning my personal expenses and discretionary spending for this itinerary?

Every traveller is different and therefore spending money requirements will vary. Some travellers may drink more than others while other travellers like to purchase more souvenirs than most. Please consider your own spending habits when it comes to allowing for drinks, shopping and tipping. Please also remember the following specific recommendations when planning your trip. ATMs are limited in Pakistan and only available in Lahore & Islamabad. Please ensure you take out sufficient funds to cover you throughout the trip.

Should I be tipping on my trip?

It is customary in Asia to tip service providers such as waiters, at approximately 5-10%, depending on the service. Tipping is expected - though not compulsory - and shows an expression of satisfaction with the people who have assisted you on your tour. Although it may not be customary to you, it is of considerable significance to the people who will take care of you during your travels. There are several times during the trip where there is opportunity to tip the local guides or drivers we use. You may do this individually, or your CEO will offer to collect the money and tip as a group. Recommendations for tipping drivers and local guides would range from \$1-\$2 USD per person per day depending on the quality and length of the service. Also at the end of each trip if you felt your G Adventures CEO did an outstanding job, tipping is appreciated. The amount is entirely a personal preference, however as a guideline \$3-\$4 USD per person, per day can be used.

What do I need to know to about safety and security on my trip?

Your Chief Experience Officer (CEO) will accompany you on all included activities. During your trip you will have some free time to pursue your own interests, relax and take it easy and explore at your leisure. While your CEO will assist you with options available in a given location, please note that any optional activities you undertake are not part of your itinerary, and we offer no representations about the safety of the activity or the standard of the operators running them. Please use your own good judgement when selecting an activity in your free time. Although the cities visited on tour are generally safe during the day, there can be risks to wandering throughout any major city at night. It is our recommendation to stay in small groups and to take taxis to and from restaurants, or during night time excursions.

Water based activities have an element of danger and excitement built into them. We recommend only participating in water based activities when accompanied by a guide(s). We make every reasonable effort to ensure the fun and adventurous element of any water based activities (in countries with varying degrees of operating standards), have a balanced approach to safety. It is our policy not to allow our CEOs to make arrangements on your behalf for water based activities that are not accompanied by guide(s).

What rules should I know before joining this trip?

Illegal drugs will not be tolerated on any trips. Possessing or using drugs not only contravenes the laws of the land but also puts the rest of the group at risk. Our philosophy of travel is one of respect towards everyone we encounter and in particular the local people who make the world the special place it is. The exploitation of people in the sex trade is completely contrary to this philosophy.
