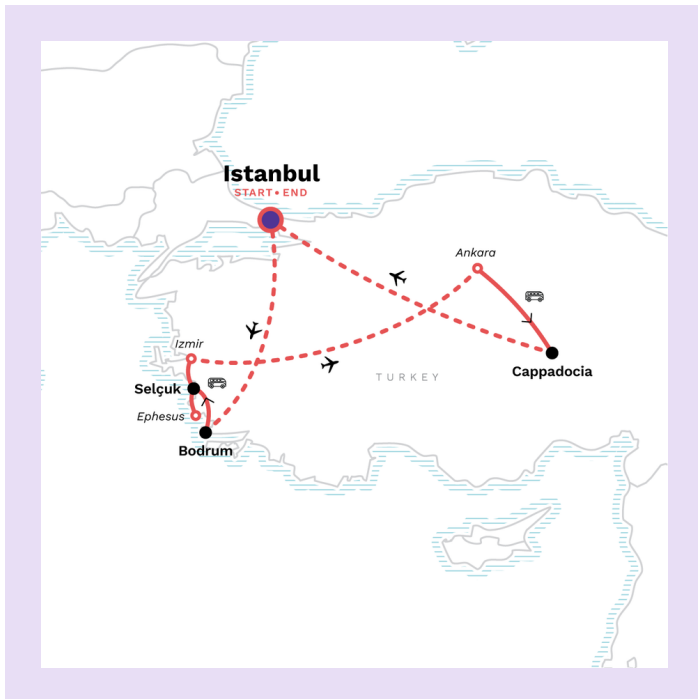

Begin the day in Istanbul with a walking tour in the old city, including a visit to the historic Hippodrome and the Blue Mosque. Be awed by the Blue Mosque's symmetry and internal tile work, and take the chance to learn more about the ceremony behind Islam, as it is a working mosque. Continue to the Basilica Cistern and then pass in front of the magnificent Hagia Sophia (or Aya Sofya), one of the great churches of the Byzantine Empire which was converted into a mosque after the Ottoman conquest. There will be time for an optional visit to the Hagia Sofia before continuing on to lunch.

Grand Bazaar Visit

Walk through the Grand Bazaar, the area locals come to do their shopping, and down to Golden Horn. Enjoy a coffee break at Buyuk Valide Han while admiring the view of Bosphorus. Visit Rustempasa Mosque.

Visit to Ancient Heraklia

Yalıkavak

Discover the captivating ruins of Ancient Heraklia, a hidden historical gem peacefully nestled along the shores of Lake Bafa. Shadowed by the dramatic granite peaks of the Latmos Mountains, this off-the-beaten-path site seamlessly intertwines with the tranquil Turkish village of Kapıkırı. Wander through silver olive groves where classical marble columns and ancient council chambers sit casually in local back gardens. Explore the spectacular Temple of Athena overlooking the water, marvel at exceptionally preserved Hellenistic city walls, and experience a raw, authentic slice of the Aegean where nature and ancient history unite.

Lunch in Yalıkavak Market

A visit to Yalıkavak's market offers a wonderful snapshot of coastal Turkish life. The lively covered bazaar features a colorful bounty of the Aegean harvest, from wild mountain herbs and regional olives

to handwoven linens and artisan crafts. The definitive finale to your afternoon stroll is a classic, local lunch nearby. Pull up a bench to enjoy hand-pressed Aegean meatballs (köfte) sizzling straight off a charcoal grill, served with fire-roasted vegetables, traditional bean salad, and a refreshing glass of ayran.

Day 5

Bodrum: Your OMG day

Today is all about you. Opt for an easy E-Bike ride exploring local history and coastal scenery, or immerse yourself in rural traditions with a Karaova village and wine tasting experience—both including a delicious local lunch. Spend a relaxing afternoon at leisure back at your hotel. In the evening, stroll down to an unforgettable seaside dinner right on the water. Savor fresh Aegean seafood and mezes while watching a stunning sunset over the neighboring Greek island of Kos.

Awaken to a sun-drenched Bodrum morning, choosing between a scenic coastal e-bike journey through history or an immersive, wine-kissed escape into Karaova's rural heritage. After a tranquil afternoon at leisure, wander to the shoreline for an enchanting seaside feast, savoring Aegean delicacies as the sun dips behind distant Kos.

Option 2: Bike from Bodrum to bohemian Gümüşlük, pedaling past windmills and olive groves. Explore ancient Myndos ruins by wading to Rabbit Island, and conclude with a waterside Aegean seafood lunch.

Step into the ancient world today, departing Bodrum to wander through the monumental ruins and historic theater of ancient Miletus. Explore the awe-inspiring Temple of Apollo at Didyma before a relaxed lunch. In the afternoon, watch coastal scenery give way to rolling hills as you travel to Selçuk and check into the peaceful Vinifera Winery estate for a delicious, locally inspired dinner.

Leave behind the sparkling Aegean to journey through time, marveling at Miletus' ancient grandeur and the towering Temple of Apollo at Didyma. As afternoon shadows lengthen, retreat to Selçuk's serene, vine-draped countryside. Settle into your tranquil winery estate, concluding the day with a locally inspired dinner amidst the vineyards.

Apollo Temple of Didyma

Aydın

Visit the Apollo temple at the ancient Greek sanctuary of Didyma. Said to have been destroyed by Persians in 494 BC, it was later restored by Alexander the Great during the 3rd century BC where it flourished for centuries thereafter.

Miletus Visit

Aydın

Visit Miletus, located near the mouth of the Maeander River. The history of Miletus goes back to 3500 BC when the ancient city was an important trading outpost for goods coming out of the interior of the country. The site and the impressive theater we will see are from the Roman period.

Private Vehicle

Bodrum - Selçuk

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Selçuk: Ephesus and Efesium Community

Dawn unveils the majestic whispers of ancient Ephesus, transitioning into heartfelt cultural exchanges with Selçuk's local guardians. After a tranquil afternoon cradled by Vinifera's timeless olive groves, share ancestral kitchen secrets with the estate owner. Night falls on an elegant garden feast, beautifully serenaded beneath the glowing, immortal ruins.

Uncover the wonders of antiquity during a morning exploration of the Ephesus archaeological site, followed by a meaningful connection with local heritage at the Selçuk community project. After a midday break for lunch on your own, unwind amidst the peaceful olive groves at Vinifera. Later, join the estate's proprietor for an interactive, hands-on culinary workshop. Your day culminates with an elegant outdoor feast showcasing your own creations, accompanied by live acoustic melodies and captivating views of the ancient ruins glowing after dark.

Tour the ruins of ancient Ephesus to get a feeling of what life must have been like during Roman times. Take in its massive, well-preserved theatre, which dominates the view down Harbour Street. See the two-story library, whose façade has been carefully reconstructed from all original pieces. Built in AD 125, it once held nearly 12,000 scrolls.

Efesium Selcuk Community Experience

Selçuk

Visit Efesium Handicrafts, a community-focused initiative that highlights local culture, history, and, in particular, handicrafts produced by local women. This is a project supported by the Selçuk Municipality where local women create and sell handmade, specially designed, and authentic souvenirs. The products reflect the 8,600-year history of the region

ACTIVITY

Tonight, Immerse yourself in Aegean culture during an exclusive cooking class with the owners of your winery hotel. You will learn to prepare traditional regional dishes using fresh, estate-grown ingredients and local olive oil. Afterward, enjoy the glamorous dinner you helped prepare, served in the olive garden. Two musicians will stroll around the tables, serenading guests as they face the beautifully illuminated ancient city of Ephesus in the distance. It is an unforgettable evening pairing exquisite local wine and heritage.

Cappadocia: Ankara and Volcanic Valleys

Watch the landscapes transform today as you catch a quick domestic flight to Ankara . Upon arrival, dive straight into the heart of the capital city with an orientation walk that brings its vibrant streets to life, pausing to savour a delicious lunch of regional specialties. In the afternoon, watch the horizon unfold from your window during a scenic drive through the changing Anatolian countryside, heading toward the surreal, fairy-tale landscapes of Cappadocia. After settling into your cave-style accommodations, the evening is yours to unwind, soak in the magical atmosphere, and discover a cozy local spot for dinner on your own.

Fly to Ankara, where the echoes of ancient empires resonate through the grand capital. From there, journey across the rugged, sun-drenched Anatolian steppes as they give way to the mystical realm of Cappadocia. Wind-sculpted volcanic valleys rise like stone waves, welcoming you to a peaceful sanctuary wrapped in twilight wonder.

Derinkuyu Underground City Visit

To enter Derinkuyu is to leave the world of light behind and descend into one of the most sophisticated engineering marvels of the ancient world. Located in the heart of Cappadocia, this subterranean metropolis reaches a depth of approximately 85 meters (280 feet) and was capable of sheltering up to 20,000 people along with their livestock and food supplies.

Cappadocia Jeep Tour

Cappadocia

Trade the rugged for the refined with a gentle Cappadocia jeep tour. This curated sunset expedition takes you off the beaten path in a private 4x4 to discover the region's most iconic hidden valleys at a serene, panoramic pace.

Cappadocia: Open Spaces, Culture and a Gondola Ride

Dawn reveals ancient cave dwellings and subterranean mysteries before clay transforms beneath your hands in a traditional workshop. Later, glide along the Red River within a majestic water flotilla as the sun dips low, culminating your timeless journey with an intimate, earth-born farewell feast deep inside a candlelit cave.

Begin your morning exploring the historic cave dwellings of Zelve Open Air Museum and the fascinating subterranean tunnels of Kaymaklı Underground City. Following lunch on your own, participate in a traditional ceramics workshop. Later, enjoy a visually stunning gondola ride along the Red River as part of a private flotilla. Conclude your memorable journey with an exclusive "From the Land to the Table" cave dinner farewell experience.

Explore the historic cave city of Zelve Open Air Museum. Wander through three rugged valleys to discover one of Cappadocia's largest ancient troglodyte communities. This striking site showcases a multi-layered history of cultural coexistence, featuring incredible rock-cut homes, churches, and a mosque carved directly into the cliffsides.

Pottery Center Visit

Learn more about the infamous local art of pottery making and take advantage of the opportunity to create your own masterpiece.

Gondola Ride on the Red River

Cappadocia

1h30m-2h

Experience a serene gondola cruise along Cappadocia's Red River in Avanos. These boats offer a picturesque glide past willow-lined banks. The journey takes place on Turkey's longest internal river. The

calm, slow-moving currents are lined with green riverbanks, weeping willows, and local waterfowl, offering a peaceful, low-tempo break from active hiking. This peaceful journey provides a relaxing contrast to the rocky valleys, deeply connecting you to the region's ancient pottery-making heritage.

What important notes should I be aware of before the trip?

ACCOMMODATION NOTE:

Please be aware that properties we stay in with only two stories may not have elevators installed and climbing the stairs with your luggage will be necessary.

RAMADAN

According to the lunar cycle, Ramadan will fall between Mar 11th - Apr 8th 2024, and Mar 1st - Mar 29th 2025. Please note that Ramadan is a month of fasting observed by Muslims throughout the world, during which time the followers of Islam should not eat or drink between sunrise and sunset. There may be some limitations to services and disruptions to schedules during Ramadan, but generally our tours still operate effectively during this period and food is available to non-Muslims throughout the day. It is very important to display increased cultural sensitivity during Ramadan. Please wear loose fitting clothes, that cover knees and shoulders, and try to avoid eating, drinking or smoking in public out of respect for those who can't at that time.

What is the group leader like?

This G Adventures group trip is accompanied by one of our group leaders, otherwise known as a Chief Experience Officer (CEO). The aim of the group leader is to take the hassle out of your travels and to help you have the best trip possible. They will provide information on the places you are travelling through, offer suggestions for things to do and see, recommend great local eating venues and introduce you to our local friends. While not being guides in the traditional sense you can expect them to have a broad general knowledge of the countries visited on the trip, including historical, cultural, religious and social aspects.

We also use local guides where we think more specific knowledge will add to the enjoyment of the places we are visiting - we think it's the best of both worlds.

What are the meals like on this trip?

Eating is a big part of traveling. Travelling with G Adventures you experience the vast array of wonderful food that is available out in the world. Generally meals are not included in the trip price when there is a choice of eating options, to give you the maximum flexibility in deciding where, what and with whom to eat. It also gives you more budgeting flexibility, though generally food is cheap. Our groups tend to eat together to enable you to taste a larger variety of dishes and enjoy each other's company. There is no obligation to do this though. Your CEO will be able to suggest favourite restaurants during your trip.

Breakfast

Turkish breakfasts are very different from your usual cereal and toast morning fare - when was the last time you had olives for breakfast? They pretty much universally consist of large slices of fresh "french style" white bread accompanied by slices of tomato, cucumber, white and yellow cheeses, olives, jam and honey. This is accompanied by tea (which a Turk would always choose!) or coffee (which is pretty much always instant coffee) You will of course want to sample the famous Turkish coffee, but it is usually taken after a big lunch or dinner, or in the late afternoon with a pastry. While we think these breakfasts are absolutely delicious, some travellers do find them a bit repetitive and enjoy buying market fruit the day before and eating this for breakfast.

Lunches

Will usually be simple and on the run. They are a great chance to try Turkey's delicious and healthy array of "fast foods". This may include, "gozleme", a type of Turkish savory crepe, "chorba", delicious lentil soup, and of course doner kebabs in both beef and chicken varieties. You won't want to miss the chance to try "pide", Turkish pizza, and lahmacun - thin crust pizza you fold greenery into. You may also find "kumpir", Turkish stuffed potatoes.

Dinner

Most Turks start their dinners with a couple of mezes - small taster dishes such as grilled octopus, aubergine salad, and many more. You could also choose a soup made of fresh local ingredients. Main courses tend to be based around fresh seafood if you are near the coast (expect to pay around 500 - 600 lira for a whole fish) or the ubiquitous kebab - skewers of charcoaled meat which comes on bread with salad. There are plenty of variations of the kebab; many regions have their own speciality so be sure to ask your leader.

Desserts

Yum - it's all about the sugar. Baklava (about 65 TL a piece for the good stuff) is something of a national obsession and it is believed the best comes from the East. There are endless varieties of pastries and milk-based deserts available and you are sure to spend at least some time in a Turkish bakery taste testing.

Snacks

Don't miss munching on a simit, a Turkish pretzel, or perhaps some grilled sweet corn to get you through between meals.

Drinks

Tea, served in small tulip glasses, is the number one beverage of choice in Turkey. It is freshly brewed and a tea bag is a rare thing. Turkish coffee is wonderful thing to try. The national beer is named Efes and is very good (usually 160 - 170 TL a bottle). Wine is made in Turkey and is getting better every year. Expect to pay around 250 - 300 liras for a glass in a restaurant. Water is approximately 35 TL for a 1.5 litre bottle, soft drinks and juices are around 70 - 80 TL.

What are the modes of transportation on my trip?

Private vehicle, ferry, gondola, jeep, plane, walking.

Are local flights included in the cost of the trip?

If required all local flights are included in the cost of your tours unless otherwise noted. It is important that we have your passport information at the time of booking in order to process these tickets. Internal flight tickets are issued locally and will be given to you prior to the flight departure.

This tour includes internal flights. Please note domestic flights in Turkey have the following carriage allowance:

Check-in: 15 kg (33 lbs)

Carry-on: 8 kg (17.5 lbs)

Where will we stay during the trip?

Hotels (8 nts), Winery (2 nts).

What kind of accommodation can I expect on this trip?

On this trip you can expect to stay in small family-run hotels or pensions (with the exception of the start and finish hotels, which are often larger city hotels), which will vary a little in standard and facilities: some may not have elevators, air-conditioning or English-speaking staff, but most importantly all are locally-run, with some traditional character, and in excellent central locations to give you maximum time for exploring the sights. You can expect to find clean, safe, simple accommodation in convenient locations.

What happens if I experience problems when arriving?

We don't expect any problems, and nor should you, but if for any reason you are unable to commence your trip as scheduled, please refer to the emergency contact details provided in this dossier and contact us as soon as possible. If you have a pre-booked transfer, and you have not made contact with our representative within 30 minutes of clearing customs and immigration, we recommend that you make your own way to the Starting Point hotel, following the Joining Instructions. Please apply to your travel agent on your return for a refund of the transfer cost if this occurs.

Who should I contact in case of an emergency?

Should you need to contact us during a situation of dire need, it is best to first call either the G Adventures Local Representative (if one is listed below) or our G Adventures Local Office. If for any reason you do not receive an immediate answer, please leave a detailed message and contact information, so they may return your call and assist you as soon as possible.

AIRPORT TRANSFER

If you have purchased an arrival through G Adventures or if an arrival transfer is included in the cost of your tour, please note that:

Your arrival transfer has been arranged based on flight information provided to us. If you are advised of a flight schedule change or flight cancellation within 48 hours of your scheduled arrival time, please call the emergency contact number to advise of your new arrival flight information. If you do not, we will not be able to rearrange your arrival transfer and you will need to make your own way to the starting hotel at your own expense. If your arrival transfer does not arrive within 30 minutes after you have exited the arrivals area please take a taxi to your start point hotel.

What should be on my packing list?

What are the visas and entry requirements for my trip?

All countries require a valid passport (with a minimum 6 months validity). Contact your local embassy or consulate for the most up-to-date visa requirements, or see your travel agent. It is your own responsibility to have the correct travel documentation. Visa requirements for your trip will vary depending on where you are from and where you are going. We keep the following information up to date as far as possible, but rules do change and sometimes without warning. While we provide the following information in good faith, it is vital that you check the information yourself and understand that you are fully responsible for your own visa requirements.

What should I consider when planning my personal expenses and discretionary spending for this itinerary?

Every traveller is different and therefore spending money requirements will vary. Some travellers may drink more than others while other travellers like to purchase more souvenirs than most. Please consider your own spending habits when it comes to allowing for drinks, shopping and tipping. Please also remember the following specific recommendations when planning your trip.

What should I know about currency, credit cards, and exchanging money while on this tour?

The local currency in Turkey is the Turkish Lira (TRY).

ATMs are found within main cities in Turkey and will generally accept cards on the Visa and Mastercard networks. It is a great idea to travel with both a Visa and Mastercard if at all possible as while there is no hard and fast rule, some banks seem to only work with one brand of card. Please note, your bank will charge a fee for overseas withdrawals.

Cash is recommended for times when ATMs are not accessible. Euros, British Pounds and US Dollars are all easy to exchange to the Local currency. Please note that you should bring some cash with you for emergency situations but carrying only cash is a high safety risk. ATM card/s and some cash is the ideal mix.

If you are bringing US Dollars, please make sure that the notes are new and in good condition. Notes older than 1996, or with any tears or blemishes may not be accepted. Be fussy with your bank when buying cash!

As currency exchange rates can fluctuate often we ask that you refer to the following website for daily exchange rates:

How much emergency money should I bring on this trip?

Please also make sure you have access to at least an additional USD \$200 (or equivalent) as an 'emergency' fund, to be used when circumstances outside our control (ex. a natural disaster) require a change to our planned route. This is a rare occurrence!

Do I need to pay a departure tax?

Normally included in departure flight tickets.

Should I be tipping on my trip?

It is customary in Turkey to leave a small tip for service providers, such as waiters, if you are pleased with the service (%10 of your bill). Tipping is an expected - though not compulsory - component of your tour program and an expression of satisfaction with the persons who have assisted you on your tour. Although it may not be customary to you, it is of considerable significance to the people who will take care of you during your travels. You may do this individually, or your CEO will offer to collect the money and tip as a group. Recommendations for tipping drivers would range from €15-20 per week depending on the quality of the service.

Also at the end of each trip if you felt your G Adventures CEO (in Turkey as they are also the tour guides for any ancient sites visited) or skipper did an outstanding job, tipping is appreciated. The amount is entirely a personal preference, however as a guideline €6-8 per person, per day can be used.

What activities are optional on this trip?

Are there any health considerations I should know before travelling?

DRINKING WATER: It is advisable to drink bottled water in Turkey.

Please note inoculations may be required for the country visited. It is your responsibility to consult with your travel doctor for up to date medical travel information well before departure.

There are no specific health requirements for this trip. However, you should consult your doctor for up-to-date medical travel information before departure. We recommend that you carry a First Aid kit and hand sanitizers / antibacterial wipes as well as any personal medical requirements. Please be aware that we are in remote areas and away from medical facilities for some time during this trip, and for legal reasons our leaders are prohibited from administering any type of drug including headache tablets, antibiotics, etc.

What do I need to know to about safety and security on my trip?

Many national governments provide a regularly updated advice service on safety issues involved with international travel. We recommend that you check your government's advice for their latest travel information before departure. We strongly recommend the use of a neck wallet or money belt while travelling, for the safe keeping of your passport, air tickets, travellers' cheques, cash and other valuable items. Leave your valuable jewellery at home - you won't need it while travelling. Many of the hotels we use have safety deposit boxes, which is the most secure way of storing your valuables. A lock is recommended for securing your luggage. When travelling on a group trip, please note that your group leader has the authority to amend or cancel any part of the trip itinerary if it deemed necessary, due to safety concerns. Your Chief Experience Officer (CEO) will accompany you on all included activities. During your trip you will have some free time to pursue your own interests, relax and take it easy and explore at your leisure. While your CEO will assist you with options available in a given location, please note that any optional activities you undertake are not part of your itinerary, and we offer no representations about the safety of the activity or the standard of the operators running them. Please use your own good judgement when selecting an activity in your free time. Although the cities visited on tour are generally safe during the day, there can be risks to wandering throughout any major city at night. It is our recommendation to stay in small groups and to take taxis to and from restaurants, or during night time excursions.

Water based activities have an element of danger and excitement built into them. We recommend only participating in water based activities when accompanied by a guide(s). We make every reasonable effort to ensure the fun and adventurous element of any water based activities (in countries with varying degrees of operating standards), have a balanced approach to safety. It is our policy not to allow our CEOs to make arrangements on your behalf for water based activities that are not accompanied by guide(s).

Swimming, including snorkeling, is always at your own risk. [Read more about travel safety](#) for ways to further enhance your personal safety while traveling.

What rules should I know before joining this trip?

Illegal drugs will not be tolerated on any trips. Possessing or using drugs not only contravenes the laws of the land but also puts the rest of the group at risk. Smoking marijuana and opium is a part of local culture in some parts of the world but is not acceptable for our travellers. Our philosophy of travel is one of respect towards everyone we encounter and in particular the local people who make the world the special place it is. The exploitation of people in the sex trade is completely contrary to this philosophy. Our CEOs have the right to expel any member of the group if drugs are found in their possession or if they utilize the services of paid sex workers, in any capacity.

Is travel insurance required for my trip?

Travel insurance is compulsory in order to participate on any of our trips. When travelling on a group trip, you will not be permitted to join the group until evidence of travel insurance has been sighted by your leader, who will take note of your insurance details. When selecting a travel insurance policy we require that at a minimum you are covered for medical expenses including emergency evacuation and repatriation. A minimum coverage of USD200,000 is required. We strongly recommend that the policy also covers personal liability, cancellation, curtailment and loss of luggage and personal effects. Some tours include adventure activities that require extra coverage (e.g. crampon use); please review your itinerary and make sure that you are covered for all included activities. If you have credit card insurance we require proof of purchase of the trip (a receipt of credit card statement) with a credit card in your name. Contact your bank for details of their participating insurer, the level of coverage and emergency contact telephone number.

Outside of capital cities and the more touristic centres, local dress is often more conservative and as a matter of respect we ask that both men and women are aware of this and recommend loose-fitting clothes with your shoulders covered.
