Day 2

DUBLIN

Step out into Dublin's lively core for an interactive scavenger hunt. Follow clues from ancient Viking foundations, through cobbled lanes, to elegant Georgian squares. The afternoon is yours to shape. Wander beneath the soaring wooden arches of Trinity College's historic library, or browse colorful artisan stalls tucked into quiet courtyards. Later, head to a local pitch for a high-energy Gaelic games session, where local coaches teach hurling and Gaelic football. Run, laugh, and get a real feel for Ireland's sporting passion, before heading back to the city for a relaxing evening.

Combine a scavenger hunt in Dublin with a thrilling mystery story for the entire family! The premise? A local art collector has acquired a medieval document at an auction and the manuscript has all of these mysterious sequences of letters that make little sense. You and your team of treasure hunters must find the priceless artifact being referenced in the manuscript. After the group briefing, the roles will be distributed for each team. Are you a born tracker? A true adventurer? Or an expert code-breaker? Once roles are assigned the hunt begins. At various locations throughout the city your team will solve encrypted codes, conquer tricky logic tasks, and search for evidence in locating the treasure. As you go, you will learn fascinating stories and facts about the history of Dublin.

Free Time

Dublin

Spend the afternoon exploring the vibrant capital of Ireland on your own. Opt to visit Trinity College Dublin and its centuries -old academic atmosphere. Perhaps view the Book of Kells, partake in Butler's Chocolate Experience, or visit Saint Patrick's Cathedral. From wandering through the city's medieval Quarter to sample fish n' chips in a cozy local pub, there's plenty to see and do in Dublin.

Gaelic Games Family Experience

Enjoy cultural immersion during an out of the ordinary activity: A Gaelic Games Family Experience. The visit combines a mixture of culture, history, tradition, and sport for an authentic Irish Game Day. Start by meeting the locals during a welcome into the heart of the local Gaelic Club. Hear stories of ancient myths and legends from expert coaches during the cultural introduction. Then, learn the ancient arts of three different sports, Hurling, Gaelic Football, and Gaelic Handball. Take part in team building activities and enjoy a day of friendly competition as a family.

Day 3

DUBLIN/KILLARNEY

Leave Dublin behind and travel west into the lush heart of County Kildare to visit the Irish National Stud & Gardens. Walk along tranquil woodland trails and meet celebrated racehorses resting in the pastures. Head south to the village of Adare for lunch, where 19th-century thatched cottages line the main road alongside mossy medieval ruins. Share a leisurely meal surrounded by flower-filled

gardens, then continue on into County Kerry. By late afternoon, arrive in Killarney, on the edge of the national park where verdant mountains meet still lakes. Settle in for a restful evening beneath the Kerry hills.

Irish National Stud & Gardens

Kildare

2h

Step into Ireland's lush heartland at the Irish National Stud & Gardens, where natural beauty and equine history come together for an engaging family adventure! Together, wander along winding woodland trails and stroll past green paddocks to meet living legends—retired champion racehorses resting in peaceful pastures. Young explorers can discover how these majestic animals are cared for before stepping into the world-famous Japanese Gardens. As a family, trace stepping-stone paths across trickling streams.

Visit and Lunch in Adare

Adare

2h

Adare, located in County Limerick, is widely celebrated as one of Ireland's prettiest villages. Set along the banks of the River Maigue, Adare is famous for its picturesque row of 19th-century thatched cottages, rich medieval heritage, and grand estates like Adare Manor. A visit here pairs history and scenic strolls with a warm culinary experience featuring local Irish ingredients.

Day 4

KILLARNEY

Set out along the iconic Ring of Kerry, where the coastline of the Iveragh Peninsula unfolds in dramatic sea cliffs and green hills. Stop at an upland farm to meet a local farmer and watch energetic border collies herd sheep on command. Pass through coastal villages taking in ocean views around every turn. Later, visit Muckross Traditional Farms for a look at rural Irish life. Tour the farm's thatched

cottages, visit a vintage schoolhouse, and roll up your sleeves for hands-on scones and butter-making experience – tasting your freshly churned creation on warm crusty bread as you return to Killarney.

ACTIVITY

Experience one of the most unusual and popular sights on the Ring of Kerry; a sheepdog demonstration! A local farmer will introduce you to his crew of sheep dogs and give a lively and fascinating demonstration that showcases what a sheepdog looks like in action. Then, listen to a talk about how a sheepdog is used to bring sheep in on farms and watch as the dogs respond to whistle commands to guide the sheep downwards from the pastures. By the end of the demonstration all of the sheep will be calmly gathered in a pen beside the group. Take part in the question-and-answer session afterwards and then enjoy a group lunch at a local pub.

Ring of Kerry Excursion

Ring of Kerry

8h

Experience Ireland's incredible natural beauty and traditional culture as we drive along the famous Ring of Kerry. Depart Killarney and journey through historic Beaufort and vibrant Killorglin, passing "the jewel of Kerry," Glenbeigh. Continue along the rugged Atlantic coast to Waterville, Charlie Chaplin's beloved holiday spot, where you'll pause for free time to enjoy lunch. Resume the drive through the picturesque coastal village of Caherdaniel and the colorful streets of Sneem and Kenmare before concluding your loop at the historic Muckross estate.

ACTIVITY

Upon arriving at the Muckross Schoolhouse, guests are greeted by the Bean an Tí (woman of the house) and the local Schoolmaster. Visitors step inside for a hands-on experience baking traditional Irish scones under expert guidance. This is followed by an interactive butter-making demonstration while the scones bake. After a nostalgic Irish school lesson from the Schoolmaster, the visit concludes with a fresh takeaway scone paired with hot tea or coffee.

Climb aboard a traditional horse-drawn jaunting car for an exciting ride through Killarney National Park. As native red deer graze in the open meadows, your driver, known as a jarvey, shares folklore and stories of the valley while guiding you toward the shimmering waters of the Lower Lake and the stone walls of 15th-century Ross Castle. Afterward, enjoy free time to explore on your own. In the evening, gather for an included dinner and evening of Irish culture.

Horse-drawn Jaunting Car Ride Through Killarney National Park

Climb aboard a jaunting car for an unforgettable family safari through Killarney National Park! Guided by a friendly local driver—your family will trot through ancient oak woodlands and along shimmering lakeshores while listening to lively local legends and history. Keep your eyes peeled for native wildlife and take in dramatic views of historic stone ruins framing the mountain backdrop.

Free Time

Killarney

Enjoy some free time during the day to explore on your own.

ACTIVITY

While parents enjoy a quiet, relaxing dinner at the hotel restaurant, young explorers head off for a special evening of discovery and dining! Throughout the trip families are inspired by learning of the importance of storytelling to Irish culture. Tonight over a family style dinner, they join the Expedition Leader to weave their own stories. When children listen to these legends and then craft their own tales to share with their parents, they are directly participating in this centuries-old tradition—turning passive listeners into active storytellers.

Follow the Shannon Estuary north to Foynes, home of the Flying Boat Museum. Explore a full-size replica of a 1930s Boeing 314 flying boat and discover how transatlantic flight first began. Sit down to a hearty family lunch at O'Regan's Restaurant. Adults can savour an Irish coffee right where it was invented, learning how warm whiskey, rich coffee, and cool cream were first paired for chilly passengers. After lunch, cross the River Shannon into County Clare. Arrive in Bunratty, check into your hotel, and spend the afternoon exploring the grounds of the castle right next door.

Foynes Flying Boat & Maritime Museum

Foynes

2h-2h30m

Step into the 1930s and 1940s at the Foynes Flying Boat & Maritime Museum, the historic hub along the Shannon Estuary where the world's first transatlantic passenger flights landed! Young aviators can climb aboard the world's only full-sized replica of a Boeing 314 Clipper, explore the vintage cockpit, and test their piloting skills on interactive flight simulators. After exploring the original radio room and control tower, sit down for a cozy family lunch featuring local specialties. Parents can enjoy an authentic highlight: tasting a freshly prepared Irish Coffee in the very building where Chef Joe Sheridan invented the iconic warm beverage in 1943 to cheer up shivering passengers arriving on a stormy night.

Bunratty Castle & Folk Park Visit

Bunratty

2h30m

Enjoy entrance into Bunratty Castle and spend time on your own visiting the historical grounds, known as the most complete and authentic castle in all of Ireland. The land on which Bunratty Castle has been built used to be a Viking trading camp in 970. Learn how the lords and ladies of this castle lived during times of bravery and battles, while taking in the views of the idyllic County Clare countryside.

Day 7

BUNRATTY

Drive through the limestone landscapes of County Clare to reach the Cliffs of Moher before the crowds as the morning mist rises off the Atlantic. Take a guided walk along the cliff's edge, listening to the roar of waves below and spotting nesting seabirds on rocky ledges. Enjoy free time to stroll along the bluffs, soaking in sweeping ocean views. Return to Bunratty for a medieval banquet inside the castle. Dine like royalty, listen to harpists and singers, and toast to a memorable family trip across the west coast of Ireland.

Cliffs of Moher Walk

Wander along the paved pathways and view the famous cliffs on Europe's western frontier. Visit the award-winning visitor center nestled into the hillside like something out of Lord of the Rings. The eco-friendly design of the center has minimal visual impact on the surrounding wild landscape. Inside there is an Interactive Exhibit, two cafes, a Heritage Craft Store, and more. The centerpiece of this space is the interpretative exhibition located in the domed roof structure of the exhibition space. Learn about the geology of the cliffs, the wildlife, and the human impacts, all sprinkled with stories about County Clare and all of Ireland.

Medieval Dinner in a Castle

Bunratty

Step back to the 15th century at Bunratty Castle for an unforgettable medieval banquet filled with history, storytelling, and hands-on dining! Cross the historic drawbridge and step into the Great Hall, where an Earl's herald and court performers welcome your family with traditional mead (or spiced juice for young guests). Guests gather around long wooden tables to enjoy a multi-course feast eaten entirely without silverware—just as medieval knights and royal ladies did! Throughout the meal, talented harpists, fiddlers, and singers bring Irish folklore and castle history to life through music and interactive performance.

What are the main highlights of this trip?

Embark on a history-fueled treasure hunt through Dublin discovering the city's most fascinating sites along the way, Channel your inner warrior in a day of traditional Gaelic games including Gaelic football hurling and handball, Learn about traditional life at a local farm, Step inside aviation history at the Foynes Flying Boat Museum, Marvel at the spectacle and majesty of the famed Cliffs of Moher learning about the cliff's geology, folklore and wildlife on a walking tour, Enjoy a medieval style dinner in a castle.

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Is there a disclaimer I should read before booking this trip?

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Is there a travel disclaimer for my itinerary I should review before booking this trip?

While it is our intention to adhere to the route described below, there is a certain amount of flexibility built into the itinerary and on occasion it may be necessary, or desirable to make alterations. The itinerary is brief, as we never know exactly where our journey will take us. Due to our style of travel and the regions we visit, travel can be unpredictable. The Trip Details document is a general guide to the tour and region and any mention of specific destinations or wildlife is by no means a guarantee that they will be visited or encountered. Aboard expedition trips visits to research stations depend on final permission.

Additionally, any travel times listed are approximations only and subject to vary due to local circumstances.

What important notes should I be aware of before the trip?

All parents/guardians are required to supervise their children at all times throughout the tour and may not leave their child under the supervision of the Expedition Leader, local guides, drivers, etc. Children are not to be left unattended.

Please note that on all Family Adventures one adult can only accompany up to two minors. If you have over two minors planning on travelling then a second adult will be required to attend.

What is the role of the group leader during this trip?

All National Geographic Family Journeys with G Adventures group trips are accompanied by two of our Expedition Leaders. The aim of the Expedition Leader is to take the hassle out of your travels and to help you have the best trip possible. They will provide information on the places you are travelling through, offer suggestions for things to do and see, recommend great local eating venues and introduce you to our local friends. While not being guides in the traditional sense; you can expect them to have a broad general knowledge of the countries visited on the trip, including historical, cultural, religious and social aspects. We also use local guides where we think more specific knowledge will add to the enjoyment of the places we are visiting- we think it's the best of both worlds.

What is the maximum and typical number of participants on this tour?

Max 22.

What meals are included in this trip?

7 breakfasts, 3 lunches, 2 dinners

What are the meals like on this trip?

Eating is a big part of traveling. Travelling with G Adventures you experience the vast array of wonderful food that is available out in the world. Generally meals are not included in the trip price when there is a choice of eating options, to give you the maximum flexibility in deciding where, what and with whom to eat. It also gives you more budgeting flexibility, though generally food is cheap. Our groups tend to eat together to enable you to taste a larger variety of dishes and enjoy each other's company. There is no obligation to do this though. Your Expedition Leader will be able to suggest favourite restaurants during your trip. The above information applies to G Adventures group trips. For Independent trips please check the itinerary for details of meals included. For all trips please refer to the meals included and budget information for included meals and meal budgets.

What are the modes of transportation on my trip?

Private vehicle, jaunting car, walking.

Is there an extra cost for travelling solo?

We believe solo travellers should not have to pay more to travel so our group trips are designed for shared accommodation and do not involve a single supplement. Single travellers joining group trips are paired in twin or multi-share accommodation with someone of the same sex for the duration of the trip. Some of our Independent trips are designed differently and solo travellers on these itineraries must pay the single trip price.

Where will we stay during the trip?

What are the joining instructions?

For details of your joining hotel please refer to your tour voucher, G Account, the G Adventures App or contact your travel agent.

An arrival transfer is included when you arrive on Day 1, or if you arrive up to three days prior provided that you have booked your pre-accommodation through National Geographic Journeys in our joining hotel. Due to customer experience and quality considerations, all services related to the tour must be continuous.

Our driver will be waiting for you with a National Geographic Family Journeys sign with your name on it. Please meet them at Gate 5, inside the airport arrivals hall, after exiting luggage claim. There most likely will be many signs, so please check carefully for your name.

Please note that day 1 is an arrival day and no activities have been planned on this day.

Upon arrival to your Joining Hotel (note that check-in time will be in the afternoon), look for a note or bulletin board in the reception with a note from your Expedition Leader. This note will give the details of your Welcome Meeting on day 1 (usually between 5pm and 7pm), where you will get a chance to meet your Expedition Leader and other travellers, as well as learn more about how the tour will run. If you don't see a note, please ask reception for details!

If you are arriving later and will miss the Welcome Meeting, your Expedition Leader will leave a note at reception for you with any information you may need, and with morning instructions for the next day.

What should I do if I can't find my airport transfer or experience arrival issues?

We don't expect any problems, and nor should you, but if for any reason you are unable to commence your trip as scheduled, please refer to the emergency contact details provided in this dossier and contact us as soon as possible. If you have a pre-booked transfer, and you have not made contact with our representative within 30 minutes of clearing customs and immigration, we recommend that you make your own way to the Starting Point hotel, following the Joining Instructions. Please apply to your travel agent on your return for a refund of the transfer cost if this occurs.

Who do I contact for arrival issues or in the event of an emergency?

Your included arrival transfer has been meticulously arranged based on the flight details you provided. If you experience a flight schedule change or cancellation within 48 hours of your scheduled arrival, please contact our emergency number immediately with your updated details. Prompt notification ensures we can adjust your transfer; otherwise, you will need to arrange your own transportation to the starting property. Upon arrival, if your transfer representative does not connect with you within 30 minutes of exiting the arrivals area, please take a local taxi directly to the starting property.

What are the packing guidelines and luggage restrictions?

We recommend using a backpack for your convenience, or a medium-sized suitcase if you prefer. A daypack is also essential for carrying everyday items. Space is limited on transportation, so there is a limit of one main piece of luggage per person. You will be responsible for carrying your own luggage. You must be prepared to carry your luggage up and down stairs, on and off transportation, and to hotels (max 15-20 mins.) It should also be noted that baggage should adhere to strict airline weight limits - 15kg for checked luggage and 6kg for hand luggage.

What should I pack for this trip?

Where can I do my laundry on this trip?

Laundry facilities are offered by some of our hotels for a charge or ask your Expedition Leader where the closest laundromat is. There will be times when you may want to or have to do your own laundry so we suggest you bring non-polluting/biodegradable soap.

What should I consider when planning my personal expenses and discretionary spending for this itinerary?

Every traveller is different and therefore spending money requirements will vary. Some travellers may drink more than others while other travellers like to purchase more souvenirs than most. Please consider your own spending habits when it comes to allowing for drinks, shopping and tipping. Please also remember the following specific recommendations when planning your trip.

What should I know about currency, credit cards, and exchanging money while on this tour?

Credit cards and debit cards are very useful for cash advances but you must remember to bring your PIN number (be aware that many ATM machines only accept 4-digit PINs). Both Cirrus and Plus system cards are the most widely accepted debit cards. Visa cards are the most widely accepted credit cards. While ATMs are commonly available, there are no guarantees that your credit or debit cards will actually work - Check with your bank. You should be aware when purchasing products or services on a credit card, that a fee usually applies.

Do not rely on credit or debit cards as your only source of money. A combination of Euros and cards is best.

Always take more rather than less, as you don't want to spoil the trip by constantly feeling short of funds.

As currency exchange rates can fluctuate often we ask that you refer to the following website for daily exchange rates: www.xe.com

What emergency funds do I need access to on this trip?

Please also make sure you have access to at least an additional USD \$200 (or equivalent) as an 'emergency' fund, to be used when circumstances outside our control (ex. a natural disaster) require a change to our planned route. This is a rare occurrence!

What are the tipping guidelines for this trip?

Local tipping is included on this Family trip which covers local guides, drivers and gratuity for included meals. At the end of your trip if you felt your two National Geographic Expedition Leaders did an outstanding job, tipping is expected and appreciated. The amount is entirely a personal preference, however as a guideline; per Expedition Leader €8-10 per person, per day can be used.

For non-included meals in restaurant, a guideline is 5-10% of cost of bill.

What activities are optional on this trip?

What general safety tips and free-time guidelines should I follow?

Many national governments provide a regularly updated advice service on safety issues involved with international travel. We recommend that you check your government's advice for their latest travel information before departure. We strongly recommend the use of a neck wallet or money belt while travelling, for the safe keeping of your passport, air tickets, travellers' cheques, cash and other valuable items. Leave your valuable jewellery at home - you won't need it while travelling. Many of the hotels we use have safety deposit boxes, which is the most secure way of storing your valuables. A lock is recommended for securing your luggage. When travelling on a group trip, please note that your group leader has the authority to amend or cancel any part of the trip itinerary if it deemed necessary, due to safety concerns. Your Chief Experience Officer (CEO) will accompany you on all included activities. During your trip you will have some free time to pursue your own interests, relax and take it easy and explore at your leisure. While your CEO will assist you with options available in a given location, please note that any optional activities you undertake are not part of your itinerary, and we offer no representations about the safety of the activity or the standard of the operators running them. Please use your own good judgement when selecting an activity in your free time. Although the cities visited on tour are generally safe during the day, there can be risks to wandering throughout any major city at night. It is our recommendation to stay in small groups and to take taxis to and from restaurants, or during night time excursions.

Water based activities have an element of danger and excitement built into them. We recommend only participating in water based activities when accompanied by a guide(s). We make every reasonable effort to ensure the fun and adventurous element of any water based activities (in countries with varying degrees of operating standards), have a balanced approach to safety. It is our policy not to allow our CEOs to make arrangements on your behalf for water based activities that are not accompanied by guide(s).

Swimming, including snorkeling, is always at your own risk. [Read more about travel safety](#) for ways to further enhance your personal safety while traveling.

What are the mandatory group rules regarding laws and behaviour?

Illegal drugs will not be tolerated on any trips. Possessing or using drugs not only contravenes the laws of the land but also puts the rest of the group at risk. Smoking marijuana and opium is a part of local culture in some parts of the world but is not acceptable for our travellers. Our philosophy of travel is one of respect towards everyone we encounter and in particular the local people who make the world the special place it is. The exploitation of people in the sex trade is completely contrary to this philosophy. Our CEOs have the right to expel any member of the group if drugs are found in their possession or if they utilize the services of paid sex workers, in any capacity.

What are the mandatory travel insurance requirements for this trip?

Travel insurance is compulsory in order to participate on any of our trips. When travelling on a group trip, you will not be permitted to join the group until evidence of travel insurance has been sighted by your leader, who will take note of your insurance details. When selecting a travel insurance policy we require that at a minimum you are covered for medical expenses including emergency evacuation and repatriation. A minimum coverage of USD200,000 is required. We strongly recommend that the policy also covers personal liability, cancellation, curtailment and loss of luggage and personal effects. Some tours include adventure activities that require extra coverage (e.g. crampon use); please review your itinerary and make sure that you are covered for all included activities. If you have credit card insurance we require proof of purchase of the trip (a receipt of credit card statement) with a credit card in your name. Contact your bank for details of their participating insurer, the level of coverage and emergency contact telephone number.
