Get ready to tick something off the bucket list. Visit the smallest country in the world—Vatican City! Stand in St Peter's Square and be wowed by colossal colonnades, numerous statues, and the obelisk. Opt to take in the magnificence of St Peter's Basilica, Michelangelo's Pietá, and the Sistine Chapel while you are in the area.

Pantheon Visit

The Pantheon is one of the most famous buildings in Rome. Originally built during the reign of Augustus (27 BC - 14 AD), the building was rebuilt under Hadrian in 126 AD. The roof is still the world's largest unreinforced concrete dome, and it contains a circular opening (an oculus). It is easily one of the best-preserved of all the ancient Roman buildings.

Even with the bustle of modern day Rome whizzing past on Vespas, you can still lose yourself in the fragmented columns and ancient ruins of this plaza, conjuring images of the rich Romans sauntering by in togas. Please note, this must be booked in combination with the Colosseum Visit and will include a visit to Palatine Hill.

Colosseum Visit

Enjoy a guided tour of this famous spot, the scene of many bloody gladiator fights for the entertainment of ancient Rome's aristocracy. Learn from your expert guide and you wander the old venue—a UNESCO World Heritage site—and feel free to walk around on your own. No battles, please!

Day 2

Rome/Capalbio

Enjoy a G Adventures supported migrant led walk of Rome before taking the train to Capalbio. On arrival continue to the villa via private transfer, then take an orientation walk around the property. Sample some home made olive oil and visit the neighbouring winery before sitting down to your first home-cooked dinner.

Settle in to the Tuscan hillside villa located in the heart of Etruria, a quaint historic region rich in archaeological sites. Take in the 360° views of the surrounding sea, countryside, and olive groves.

Enjoy a brief walk with your CEO. He/she will give you some tips on finding things like supermarkets, main squares, and ATMs. For more specific or in-depth information, an official guided tour is recommended.

Free Time

Capalbio

Take a trip back in time on an exploration of this perfectly preserved medieval town. Walk through the main square and explore the Church of San Nicola dating back to the 12th century decorated with Romanesque capitals and Renaissance frescoes. Visit the Tarot Garden, an esoteric sculpture garden depicting the 22 Major Arcanes of tarot cards. Catch some rays on the beaches of Capalbio, which stretch over twelve unobstructed kilometers.

Il Giardino dei Tarocchi (Tarot Garden)

Capalbio

Explore Capalbio's famous sculpture garden based on esoteric tarot. Inspired by Gaudi's sculpture garden Park Güell in Barcelona, this garden was created by French artist Niki de Saint Phalle. The garden contains twenty two monumental figures depicting the figures of the Major Arcana, symbolizing the deepest aspects of life.

Capalbio is the only section of the Maremma region with a coastline that runs unbroken for nearly 12km (7mi). There are several untouched and unspoiled beaches. Check out Feniglia beach, often named Tuscany's best beach for it's clear waters and white sands.

Day 4

Capalbio

Transfer to the seaside region of Monte Argentario for a full day of exploration. Opt to wander around the port villages, take a hike in the Tuscan hillside, or spend the day snorkelling at sea. Return to the villa in the evening.

This sunny peninsula is connected to the Tuscan mainland by three narrow sandbars, making this spot ideal for exploring the olive-grove spotted hillside, or floating in the azure sea. For those looking for a glimpse into local life, grab a scoop of gelato and wander around the fishing village of Porto Ercole or the lively Porto Santo Stefano. Take in this region's uniquely rugged, natural beauty.

Opt to enjoy the villa and surrounding area, or explore further afield on a bike ride to Feniglia beach, visit the archeological site of Cosa, soak in the local hot springs. Tonight, enjoy a free night to explore Capalbio and opt to enjoy a dinner of traditional Tuscan fare at a local restaurant.

Feniglia Bike and Beach

Feniglia

Rent a bike and ride to Capalbio's most famous beach, Feniglia beach. Its crystal clear waters are perfect for a dip. The Mediterranean pinewoods which surround the beach are also a great place to stop for a picnic.

Cosa Archeological Site

Cosa

Visit the first Roman colony in Maremma dating back to 273BC. Built between two hills, Cosa became a strategic point to control both the land and sea traffic that passed through Tuscany on its way to Rome. Its ruins are a site to behold located on a gorgeous stretch of countryside, looking out to sea. Go back in time and walk among the ruins and explore the ancient villa in the Forum.

Saturnia Village Visit and Hot Springs

Explore the small hilltop town of Saturnia. Situated close to an Etruscan necropolis, it's origins are extremely ancient and fascinating to explore. Afterwards relax in the thermal springs. Rich in mineral deposits, the thermal waters have a temperature of 35 °C (95°F) and several therapeutic and relaxing properties. So take a dip and enjoy!

Another free day to explore this region or relax at the villa. Opt to take a trip to the quaint Etruscan town of Pitigliano. In the evening, try your hand at Tuscan cuisine during a cooking class, and indulge in tastings of olive oil and local liquors.

Pitigliano is known as Little Jerusalem because of the large Jewish population that settled here in the 16th century while avoiding the Vatican's Counterreformation persecution. Discover the town's Jewish quarter and the many Etruscan remains visible throughout the town.

Reflect on memories made and the places you have visited while taking your return transfer to Rome. Return via bus and train, then depart in the early afternoon from the Rome train station (Termini).

This tour will end upon arrival in Rome at approximately 12pm. We suggest booking any onward travel after 3pm.

If you wish to extend your stay in Rome, consider booking post-tour accommodation with us. Please speak to a G Adventures representative about booking accommodations in Rome after your tour ends.

Is there a travel disclaimer for my itinerary I should review before booking this trip?

While it is our intention to adhere to the route described below, there is a certain amount of flexibility built into the itinerary and on occasion it may be necessary, or desirable to make alterations. The itinerary is brief, as we never know exactly where our journey will take us. Due to our style of travel and the regions we visit, travel can be unpredictable. The Trip Details document is a general guide to the tour and region and any mention of specific destinations or wildlife is by no means a guarantee that they will be visited or encountered. Aboard expedition trips visits to research stations depend on final permission.

Additionally, any travel times listed are approximations only and subject to vary due to local circumstances.

How large will the group be?

Max 14, Avg 10.

What meals are included in this trip?

6 breakfasts, 3 dinners

What are the meals like on this trip?

Eating is a big part of traveling. Travelling with G Adventures you experience the vast array of wonderful food that is available out in the world. On this trip, you have included 6 continental breakfasts and 3 dinners using local and often organic ingredients.

What are the modes of transportation on my trip?

Minibus, train, walking.

What transportation will we take on this trip?

Transport on this trip will mostly be by train and private minibus. The train systems in Italy are generally good with seat reservations and toilet/snack facilities on longer journeys.

Please note that you **MUST** be comfortable carrying your own luggage as you can expect stairs in Italian train stations (very few are equipped with escalators or elevators). You may be required to carry your luggage short distances (up to 20 mins walk), in larger cities and occasionally the group will take taxis to and from hotels.

Where will we stay during the trip?

Hotel (1 nt), locally owned agriturismo/guesthouse (5 nts).

What kind of accommodation can I expect on this trip?

For the duration of our trip we stay at the same villa. Located about a 10 minute drive from the medieval town of Capalbio, our hilltop villa is surrounded by greenery with panoramic views of the sea, olive groves and surrounding countryside. Perfectly nestled in the heart of the Etruria province, an area rich in archeological sites and rich natural landscape, the property is just a short 8km (4miles) from the beach and approximately 1 hour from Monte Argentario. The rooms are warmly decorated with a variety of rural and sea views. Rooms in the main house share bathroom facilities, while rooms in the annex have ensuite bathrooms. An outdoor pool is also available starting in June through the end of September.

If you would like to share a room with your travelling companion, please make sure you book together, selecting twin or double room according to your preference. Available room types are always shown on each particular tour, and we cannot guarantee your room type will be able to be changed at a later date. If you are unable to book at the same time as your travelling companion, please contact us directly as soon as possible so that we can check availability and, if possible, assign you to the correct room type.

What are the joining instructions?

Please note that day 1 is an arrival day and no activities have been planned on this day. Upon arrival to the city on day 1 (or earlier if you have booked pre-accommodation with us), please make your way to the joining hotel (note that check-in time will be in the afternoon). Once you arrive at the hotel, look for a note or bulletin board in the reception with a note from your CEO. This note will give the details of your Welcome Meeting on day 1 (usually between 5pm and 7pm), where you will get a chance to meet your CEO and other travellers, as well as learn more about how the tour will run. If you don't see a note, please ask reception for details!

If you are arriving later and will miss the Welcome Meeting, your CEO will leave a note at reception for you with any information you may need, and with morning instructions for the next day.

Joining Instructions:

By Bus from the Airport:

Shuttle buses run from Fiumicino airport and Ciampino Airport to Termini station in the city centre approximately every half hour. Look for the Terravision stand at the arrival terminal. Cost is €5 one way and takes approximately 1 hour.

By Train from the Airport:

The Leonardo Express is the name of the train that will shuttle you from Rome's main international airport, Fiumicino, to central Rome's Termini station. A Leonardo Express train leaves every half hour in each direction.

Trains to Roma Termini Station start at 6:35 in the morning with trains running at 5 and 35 minutes after the hour. The last train of the day departs at 11.35pm. The train station is open 4am to 1am and covers 35 km in around 30 minutes. Cost is 14 Euros per person. Tickets for Leonardo Express are available at rail ticket office, newspaper seller, tobacconist's, and self-service tellers, each located in the railway station atrium.

Upon arrival at Termini Station, continue by metro or on foot to your start hotel.

NOTE:

You must always stamp tickets in the machines on the platform before starting your journey.

By Taxi from the Airport:

Taxis run fixed rates to and from airports. The rate is 40 EUR. The rate for designated Fiumicino taxi drivers is 60 EUR and are inclusive of luggage, for a maximum of four passengers.

What are the visas and entry requirements for my trip?

All countries require a valid passport (with a minimum 6 months validity). Contact your local embassy or consulate for the most up-to-date visa requirements, or see your travel agent. It is your own responsibility to have the correct travel documentation. Visa requirements for your trip will vary depending on where you are from and where you are going. We keep the following information up to date as far as possible, but rules do change and sometimes without warning. While we provide the following information in good faith, it is vital that you check the information yourself and understand that you are fully responsible for your own visa requirements.

For other nationalities, travelling in Europe has been simplified with the introduction of the Schengen visa. As a visitor to the Schengen area (Austria, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Greece, Norway, Denmark, Iceland, Portugal, Finland, Italy, Spain, France, Luxembourg, Sweden, Czech Republic, Hungary, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia and Switzerland) you will enjoy the many advantages of this unified visa system. Generally speaking with a Schengen visa, you may enter one Schengen country and travel freely throughout the Schengen region during the validity of your visa. There are limited border controls at Schengen borders, if any at all.

Please note that the UK and Ireland are NOT part of the Schengen agreement.

A Schengen visa is applied for at the Embassy or Consulate of the Schengen country in which you will be spending the most nights on your trip to the Schengen space. If you are only visiting one country on your trip then you apply for your visa at the Consulate of this Schengen country.

What should I consider when planning my personal expenses and discretionary spending for this itinerary?

Every traveller is different and therefore spending money requirements will vary. Some travellers may drink more than others while other travellers like to purchase more souvenirs than most. Please consider your own spending habits when it comes to allowing for drinks, shopping and tipping. Please also remember the following specific recommendations when planning your trip.

Should I be tipping on my trip?

While conventions can vary from country to country, tipping is customary in Europe. A general rule is 10% of the bill for wait staff, and a smaller amount (€1 or €2) for other service providers.

Tipping is an expected - though not compulsory - component of your tour program, and an expression of satisfaction with the persons who have assisted you on your tour. Although it may not be customary to you, it is of considerable significance to the people who will take care of you during your travels. There are several times during the trip where there is opportunity to tip the local guides. You may do this individually, or your CEO will offer to collect the money and tip as a group. Recommendations for tipping local guides would range from €3-5 per day, depending on the quality and length of the service; ask your CEO for specific recommendations based on the circumstances and culture.

At the end of each trip, if you felt your G Adventures CEO did an outstanding job, tipping is expected and appreciated. The precise amount is a personal preference, however €30-€40 per person, per week can be used as a guideline.

What do I need to know to about safety and security on my trip?

Many national governments provide a regularly updated advice service on safety issues involved with international travel. We recommend that you check your government's advice for their latest travel information before departure. We strongly recommend the use of a neck wallet or money belt while travelling, for the safe keeping of your passport, air tickets, travellers' cheques, cash and other valuable items. Leave your valuable jewellery at home - you won't need it while travelling. Many of the hotels we use have safety deposit boxes, which is the most secure way of storing your valuables. A lock is recommended for securing your luggage. When travelling on a group trip, please note that your group leader has the authority to amend or cancel any part of the trip itinerary if it deemed necessary, due to safety concerns. Your Chief Experience Officer (CEO) will accompany you on all included activities. During your trip you will have some free time to pursue your own interests, relax and take it easy and explore at your leisure. While your CEO will assist you with options available in a given location, please note that any optional activities you undertake are not part of your itinerary, and we offer no representations about the safety of the activity or the standard of the operators running them. Please use your own good judgement when selecting an activity in your free time. Although the cities visited on tour are generally safe during the day, there can be risks to wandering throughout any major city at night. It is our recommendation to stay in small groups and to take taxis to and from restaurants, or during night time excursions.

Water based activities have an element of danger and excitement built into them. We recommend only participating in water based activities when accompanied by a guide(s). We make every reasonable effort to ensure the fun and adventurous element of any water based activities (in countries with varying degrees of operating standards), have a balanced approach to safety. It is our policy not to allow our CEOs to make arrangements on your behalf for water based activities that are not accompanied by guide(s).

What rules should I know before joining this trip?

Illegal drugs will not be tolerated on any trips. Possessing or using drugs not only contravenes the laws of the land but also puts the rest of the group at risk. Smoking marijuana and opium is a part of local culture in some parts of the world but is not acceptable for our travellers. Our philosophy of travel is one of respect towards everyone we encounter and in particular the local people who make the world the special place it is. The exploitation of people in the sex trade is completely contrary to this philosophy. Our CEOs have the right to expel any member of the group if drugs are found in their possession or if they utilize the services of paid sex workers, in any capacity.

How old must I be to join this trip?

You must be 18 to travel unaccompanied on a G Adventures tour. For minors travelling with a guardian over 21 years old, the minimum age is 12.

Are international flights included in this trip?

No, international flights are generally not included in the price of your tour.

However, on some combo tours travelling between two different countries, international flights are included as part of the itinerary and price of the tour. Please speak to your GCO or booking agent for further details.

In addition, check-in times and baggage allowances/restrictions vary by airline and can change at any time. For the most up-to-date information for your flight, please contact your airline. We recommend checking in online in advance to avoid potential delays at the airport.

What should LGBTQ+ travellers know about safety and travel considerations on this trip?
