Day 1

ATHENS

Welcome to Greece. Your expedition begins as you touch down in Athens, the ancient capital where the pulse of history beats beneath a modern metropolis. You will be met at the airport and transferred to your hotel to settle in. In the evening, gather with your National Geographic Expedition Leader and fellow travellers for a welcome reception followed by a delicious dinner at the rooftop restaurant. Gaze out at the illuminated Acropolis glowing golden against the night sky, standing guard over the winding streets of the Plaka old town below.

Arrival Transfer

You will be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel to start your adventure.

ACTIVITY

Your opportunity to meet your Expedition Leader and fellow travellers, and learn more about your tour. Don't forget to see the notice in the lobby (or ask reception) for the official time and place to meet up with the group. There will be an included group welcome dinner after the meeting.

Day 2

ATHENS

Set off this morning to wander the ancient Agora, standing where Socrates once spoke and democracy was born, then venture into the vibrant Plaka neighborhood. Visit Shedia Home, a non-profit café supporting the homeless, and participate in a hands-on upcycling workshop before a delicious lunch of fresh local ingredients. Later, immerse yourself in ancient history on an exploration of the New Acropolis Museum to examine the Parthenon frieze up close, then ascend the sacred rock to stand before the Parthenon itself, marveling at the symmetry of the columns against the vivid blue sky.

TODAY'S ACTIVITIES

Ancient Agora Visit Athens

Explore the ruins, located in the heart of modern Athens, which were once the site of the marketplace in ancient times. It was the political, cultural, social and economic centre of the ancient world, where the likes of Socrates, Plato and affluent Athenians used to gather to discuss philosophy, political issues, exchange gossip and trade.

ACTIVITY

Take time to relax at Shedia Home, a non-profit cafe providing purpose and employment to over 150 individuals experiencing homelessness in Athens. You'll enjoy a drink while one of Shedia's guides recounts the recent history of Greece's financial crisis which has made initiatives like Shedia even more important for those who have found themselves without work and shelter. Your stop here supports their programs - including the cafe, art program, and magazine - all dedicated to supporting the community.

Acropolis Museum Visit Athens 1h-3h

Visit the Acropolis Museum to see some of the artifacts and artworks discovered during excavations of the Acropolis. With over 25,000 square meters (82,020 ft) the museum is architecturally as interesting

as the collection. The museum is built over an archaeological dig site and there is an impressive view of the Acropolis from the third floor.

Day 3

ATHENS/KALAMPÁKA

Depart Athens for the legendary pass of Thermopylae to stand before the statue of Leonidas, honoring the 300 Spartans who held the line of battle. Continue north as the landscape shifts to the surreal, towering rock pillars of Meteora. After lunch, join a local expert for an off-the-beaten-path exploration away from the crowds. Visit an active monastery, admire 11th-century frescoes in the Byzantine Church of the Virgin Mary, and walk to hidden hermit caves tucked into the cliffs. Take in breathtaking panoramic views of Mount Olympus before dinner at a local restaurant, watching the shadows lengthen over the valley.

Discover the wonders of Meteora through a visit to St. Stephen's Monastery and the historic Church of the Virgin Mary, renowned for its 11th-century artistry. After, take a short walk to the secluded Hermit Caves and take in unparalleled panoramic views of the entire landscape.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Start the day with a presentation about the spiritual architecture of the region then step back 130,000 years at the Theopetra Prehistoric Cave. Guided by an archaeologist, uncover the traces of early human life in this ancient site, seeing footprints of our ancestors. After a local brunch, continue on to the Hermit Caves of Agios Theodosios for a private visit to the secluded religious retreat. After lunch, enjoy free time before venturing into the damp, mossy forests for a thrilling truffle hunt. Follow an expert hunter and their trained dog as they sniff out "black diamonds" in the earth, culminating in a short tasting of these incredible and rare local delicacies

Day 5

KALAMPÁKA / DELPHI

Travel south, stopping at the Hosios Loukas Monastery to admire its Byzantine mosaics and peaceful courtyards before arriving at Delphi, clinging to the slopes of Mount Parnassus and considered to be the “navel” of the ancient world. Explore the sanctuary with a local guide and walk in the footsteps of pilgrims along the Sacred Way to the Temple of Apollo. Marvel at the theatre and stadium carved into the mountainside, offering sweeping views of the valley. In the evening, enjoy an open-air barbecue dinner featuring homemade savory pies, perched on a cliff overlooking Greece's largest continuous olive grove.

Visit the ancient city of Delphi, at the base of Mount Parnassos. The UNESCO World Heritage Site includes ancient buildings like treasuries, a stadium, a gymnasium, an altar, hippodrome and the Temple of Apollo.

Temple of Athena Pronaia Photo Stop Delphi 30m

Capture the iconic image of Delphi with a brief photo stop at the Temple of Athena Pronaia, home to the famous circular Tholos. This visit offers a stunning perspective of the sanctuary's graceful columns set against the dramatic, steep backdrop of the Parnassus mountain range.

Day 6

DELPHI/OLYMPIA

Journey to Olympia, the UNESCO World Heritage site where the Olympic Games began in 776 BC. Explore the ancient ruins and walk under the archway into the stadium, visualizing athletes standing before the temples of Zeus and Hera. Visit the archaeological museum to deepen your understanding of the site's significance. In the evening, head to a family-owned olive farm and learn the secrets of harvesting and pressing techniques from the owners before sampling the fresh, peppery oil. Delve into an al fresco dinner of delicious local specialties, surrounded by the silvery leaves of the groves.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Guided Visit to Olympia Archaeological Site and Museum **Olympia** 2h-4h

Olympia, the birthplace of the Olympic Games, lies in a lush valley filled with symbolic ruins and captivating landscapes. Wander through the ancient olive groves to see remains of the Temple of Hera (today the starting point of the Olympic torch relay), the Temple of Zeus (a model for the development of Doric architecture) and the great Stadium of Olympia. Visit the nearby Archaeological Museum, whose collection spans over 3,500 years of Greek history. Here, find sculptures depicting Hermes and the Infant Dionysus, Zeus and Ganymede, and Nike of Paionios.

ACTIVITY

Go behind the scenes for an exclusive visit to a family-owned estate, where you will meet the owners and discover the time-honored secrets of harvesting and pressing olives. After an expert-led tasting, enjoy a private al fresco dinner featuring regional specialties paired with local wine or beer in a beautifully branded, intimate setting.

Day 7

OLYMPIA/NÁFPLIO

Travel to the coastal town of Nafplio, one of Greece's most romantic destinations with its Venetian architecture and seaside promenades. Board a small boat for a short ride to Bourtzi Castle, a fortress perched on a harbour island that once guarded the city. Stroll among the fortifications before returning to the mainland. Join a guided walk through the narrow, bougainvillea-draped alleyways of the old town, discovering hidden squares and neoclassic mansions before a dinner of Greek delicacies. Finish the evening with a scoop of gelato – a sweet end to a beautiful day by the sea.

Take a short Expedition Leader led orientation walk through the elegant streets of Nafplio, Greece's first modern capital, to discover its unique blend of Venetian, Ottoman, and Neoclassical charm.

Bourtzi Castle Náfplio 1h

Take a short ferry ride to this Venetian landmark - a medieval castle off the coast of Nafplio. A visit here offers visitors the chance to explore the castle's rooms, and a great views of the city on shore.

Walking Tour of Nafplio Náfplio 30m 2km

Explore the highlights of Nafplio's Old Town, from its charming alleys to its impressive landmarks. The walking tour offers perfect views of Bourtzi Castle and Palamidi Fortress, giving you a great overview of the city's unique history.

Day 8

NÁFPLIO

Set off from the hotel for a visit of the fortified city and open-air museum of Mycenae. Pass beneath the iconic Lion Gate to discover the royal palace, the ancient grave circle, and the monumental Tomb of Agamemnon, feeling the weight of a civilization that inspired Homer's epics. Next, visit an award-winning winery to meet the owners, learn about the winemaking process from vine to bottle, and sample distinct Greek varietals like Agiorgitiko over a delicious gourmet lunch in the vineyard.

Once a major settlement of Greek civilization, Mycenae was occupied during the Neolithic period around 4000 BC, and is linked to the mythology in Homer's epics the Iliad and the Odyssey.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Experience an exclusive National Geographic Signature moment with a private visit to the Bairaktaris Winery, where you will meet the owners for a personal tour of their storied estate and cellars. Pause at the Corinth Canal to see the engineering marvel connecting the Ionian and Aegean seas, cutting through solid rock. Return to Athens for a guided visit of the National Archaeological Museum, home to the world's finest collection of Greek antiquities, including the Mask of Agamemnon. In the evening, gather for a family-style farewell dinner, toasting your journey through the ages in the shadow of the Acropolis.

Are there any additional packing suggestions I should consider?

When deciding what to pack, considerations will vary based on your specific itinerary, the regions you are visiting, and the season in which you are travelling. What are the visas and entry requirements for my trip?

Securing the necessary visas and travel documentation is an essential step in preparing for your upcoming expedition, and remains the responsibility of each individual traveller. Entry requirements fluctuate depending on your nationality and destination; while we strive to provide the most current information, immigration regulations change frequently. We strongly advise verifying all entry protocols directly with the relevant embassy or consulate well in advance of your departure. Please also ensure your passport remains valid for at least six months beyond your scheduled departure date from the country.

Tavelling in Europe has been simplified with the introduction of the Schengen visa. As a visitor to the Schengen area (Austria, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Greece, Norway, Denmark, Iceland, Portugal, Finland, Italy, Spain, France, Luxembourg, Sweden, Czech Republic, Hungary, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia and Switzerland) you will enjoy the many advantages of this unified visa system. Generally speaking with a Schengen visa, you may enter one Schengen country and travel freely throughout the Schengen region during the validity of your visa. There are limited border controls at Schengen borders, if any at all.

Please note that the UK and Ireland are NOT part of the Schengen agreement.

A Schengen visa is applied for at the Embassy or Consulate of the Schengen country in which you will be spending the most nights on your trip to the Schengen space. If you are only visiting one country on your trip then you apply for your visa at the Consulate of this Schengen country.

As of 2025, various European countries are introducing ETIAS travel authorisation as an entry requirement for visa-exempt nationals.

What should I consider when planning my personal expenses and discretionary spending for this itinerary?

While personal spending habits naturally vary, we recommend factoring in your individual preferences for shopping, tipping, and beverages to ensure a seamless experience. In addition to these day-to-day comforts, we kindly ask that you maintain access to a minimum of USD \$200 (or its equivalent) as a dedicated emergency fund; though exceptionally rare, unpredictable circumstances such as changing weather patterns or natural events may occasionally necessitate a shift from our planned route, and this reserve ensures we can navigate any path ahead with peace of mind.

What should I know about currency, credit cards, and exchanging money while on this tour?

Credit cards and debit cards are very useful for cash advances. Visa cards are the most widely accepted cards. While ATMs are commonly available, there are no guarantees that your credit or debit cards will actually work in Greece. Check with your bank. You should be aware when purchasing products or services on a credit card, that a fee usually applies. Do not rely on credit or debit cards as your only source of money. A combination of Euros and cards is best. Always take more rather than less, as you don't want to spoil the trip by constantly feeling short of funds.

Should I be tipping on my trip?

To ensure a seamless and elevated experience throughout your National Geographic Signature departure, gratuities have been fully taken care of for all included meals, activities, and luggage portage.

On our National Geographic Signature tours, tipping is included for all included activities and meals, and portage. Tipping is not included for the Expedition Leader. Should you want some basic guidelines on tipping for the activities you do on your own, please see below. At the end of each trip if you felt your National Geographic Signature Expedition Leader did an outstanding job, tipping is appreciated. The amount is entirely a personal preference, however as a guideline would be \$10-\$15 per person per day. Tipping is neither required nor expected for your National Geographic Expedition Expert.

For the independent moments on your itinerary, tipping is generally expected across Europe. Should you wish to reward exceptional service during independent dining or activities, a gratuity of 10% is appropriate.

To safeguard the well-being of the group, we reserve the right to excuse any traveller from all or part of an itinerary if, in the professional judgment of our Expedition Leader, continuing would pose an undue risk to themselves or their fellow travellers.

To ensure your well-being and security throughout our explorations, we recommend consulting your home government's regularly updated international travel advisories prior to departure.
