Day 1

KOROR, PALAU

Welcome to Palau. Your expedition begins as you touch down in Koror, greeted by the warm, humid embrace of the tropics. You will be met and transferred to your hotel to settle in—take a moment to breathe in the salt air and feel the immediate relief of the warm, tropical breeze. Use this time to rest and adjust to the slower island pace before the extraordinary marine and cultural treasures of the Rock Islands unfold tomorrow.

Please note, there are no planned activities today and your Welcome Meeting will be held on day 2.

Discover the award-winning Palau Pacific Resort, a luxurious yet practical base just 30 minutes from Koror International Airport. The resort offers 160 elegant rooms, including Ocean Front escapes, with excursions departing from its private dock and easy access to local dining.

Unwind on the pristine 300-metre private beach and marine sanctuary, relax by the infinity pool, explore the forest trail for birdwatching, or scuba dive with the on-site expert dive centre.

Arrival Transfer

You will be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel to start your adventure.

Day 2

NIKKO BAY

Gather with your National Geographic Expedition Leader and National Geographic Expedition Expert for a welcome presentation on Palau's unique nature and culture before boarding a boat to Nikko Bay. Glide across turquoise waters to your first snorkel sites: the vibrant Rembrandt's Cove and another epic location teeming with life. Immerse yourself in the silent world beneath the surface, marveling at the density of marine biodiversity. After lunch on board, connect with Palau's seafaring heritage during a meeting with the crew of a traditional Moana canoe. Return to the hotel to refresh before a welcome cocktail reception and dinner featuring a mesmerizing performance by Palauan dancers.

ACTIVITY

Your opportunity to meet your Expedition Leader and fellow travellers, and learn more about your tour. Don't forget to see the notice in the lobby (or ask reception) for the official time and place to meet up with the group.

Introduction to Palau Nature and Culture **Koror**

Join a National Geographic Expedition Expert of an intro presentation on the culture and nature of Palau.

Nikko Bay Snorkel Site **Koror**

Head to Rembrandt's cove for the first snorkel and spend the rest of the day exploring and snorkeling Lettuce Coral Wall or Disney Bay (weather dependent).

Moana Canoe **Koror**

Encounter a traditional outrigger canoe, the vessel that inspired the design in the film Moana. Discover the history of these hand-carved craft, powered by paddles and woven sails, and learn of the ancestral art of wayfinding, using celestial navigation to traverse the Pacific.

Free Time at the Resort in Koror **Koror**

During your free time, relax at your hotel or explore your surroundings.

Welcome Reception in Koror **Koror**

Enjoy a Welcome cocktail reception by the pool before the welcome dinner at the resort.

Day 3

RISONG BAY

Begin with a visit to the Coral Reef Research Foundation to meet a researcher and learn about their vital work, including the search for medicinal compounds in marine invertebrates. Then, snorkel the crystal-clear waters of Blue Devil Gardens before boarding a boat to Risong Bay. Navigate the silence of the mangrove forest, listening for endemic birds and searching the shallows for baby sharks. After a grilled lunch on a secluded beach, snorkel the Mandarin Fish Lake. Scan the water for the dazzling, psychedelic colors of the mandarin fish before returning to the resort.

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TODAY'S ACTIVITIES

ACTIVITY

Visit the Coral Reef Research Foundation (CRRF), which was founded in 1991 and has been leading conservation efforts and research in Palau. Explore the world of marine invertebrates in newly discovered marine lakes who protect themselves with a cornucopia of bizarre chemical compounds. Much like the medicinal plants of the Amazon rainforest, these sponges & ascidians may hold unique proteins which could one day help cure cancer and deadly diseases. Meet with a researcher from the CRRF to better understand the bio diversity of Palau's marine environment.

A day at Risong Bay **Koror**

Paddle by kayak gently in search of baby sharks, endemic birds, and rare orchids before relaxing at Blue Devil Beach and snorkeling at Blue Devil Garden. Enjoy lunch before continuing to snorkel Mandarin Fish Lake for the final snorkel of the day.

Free Time at the Resort in Koror Koror

During your free time, relax at your hotel or explore your surroundings.

Day 4

ULONG ISLAND

Combine exploration with active conservation at Ulong Island. Snorkel below the Ulong Arch, a natural limestone bridge which underneath teems with colourful fish and soft corals. Here, you will assist in restoring native populations by placing young, farmed giant clams onto the reef – a hands-on contribution to the ecosystem. Step ashore onto the island and walk through an old-growth forest to the site of an ancient village, where your Leader will share the history of the Rock Island people who once thrived here. Enjoy a traditional Palauan barbecue lunch on the beach, followed by a talk on local conservation. The afternoon concludes with a drift snorkel through the dynamic currents and marine life of Wilson's Channel.

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TODAY'S ACTIVITIES

Ulong Island Snorkel

Koror

Transfer by boat out to Ulong Arch to see the beautiful corals and colors and help restore the native clam population by placing young farmed clams on the reef to grow into adults. After, head to the beach for a Palauan BBQ lunch. In the afternoon, explore the reef at Wilson's Channel before heading back to the resort.

Day 5

LONG LAKE

Spend the morning kayaking under the dense, green canopy of Long Lake. Paddle quietly through this delicate ecosystem, observing nesting birds, ferns, and wild orchids reflected in the calm water. Continue to the Milky Way, a secluded milky-turquoise lagoon famous for its white limestone mud. Indulge in a natural spa treatment by covering yourself in the mineral-rich mud found on the sea floor. After washing off and enjoying a beach lunch, snorkel the multi-colored brain corals of Einstein's Garden, a site known for its unique cerebral formations. Conclude the day with dinner at a restaurant elegantly built over the lagoon, watching the moon rise over the water.

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TODAY'S ACTIVITIES

Long Lake Paddle and Snorkel **Koror**

In the morning, kayak among the mangrove forest of Long lake. Later, head to an area called the Milky Way to discover white mud and have the opportunity for a white mud bath. After, enjoy another beach lunch before snorkeling among the multi colored brain corals of Einstein's Garden and return back to the resort.

Day 6

PATCH REEFS

Snorkel the massive coral colony known as the Reef Fish Apartment House, towering Turbinaria structures whose folds shelter dozens of fish species. After lunch on the beach, delve into the region's wartime history with a talk on the impact of WWII. Snorkel from the beach to inspect the haunting remains of a Japanese Zero fighter plane resting in the shallow seabed, now an artificial reef. Your final stop is Rainbow Reef, a kaleidoscope of soft corals and fish that showcases the full spectrum of Palau's biodiversity. Tonight, enjoy an authentic dinner at a small, local café, experiencing the island's hospitality firsthand.



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TODAY'S ACTIVITIES

Patch Reefs and Ngeanges Island **Koror**

Start the day by transferring to Fantasy Island by boat and snorkeling over Table and Staghorn Corals. Afterwards, snorkel in an area know as "Reef Fish Apartment House", a massive colony of Turbinaria frondens coral. After, enjoy another delicious beach lunch and snorkel out to see the remains of a WWII Japanese Zero fighter plane. End the day at Rainbow Reef, which arguably boasts the finest coral and fish diversity inside the reef before continuing back to the resort for free time.

Day 7

NGEMELIS ISLAND

Head to the outer reefs for a drift snorkel at the legendary Big Drop-Off. Using the currents to guide you, float effortlessly past a sheer underwater wall covered in giant sea fans and sponges, watching sea turtles and schools of pyramid butterflyfish in this "Underwater Serengeti." Lunch is served onboard while the crew actively scouts the horizon for pods of playful spinner dolphins. The afternoon concludes at the German Channel, a man-made cut in the reef that attracts filter feeders. Snorkel the channel in hopes of spotting majestic manta rays gliding through the open water. Enjoy the evening and dinner at your leisure to reflect on the day's incredible marine encounters.

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TODAY'S ACTIVITIES

Ngemelis Island **Koror**

Start the day with a boat transfer to Ngemelis Island to snorkel in an area known as the "Big Drop-off" before continuing on to Fairyland Gardens for additional snorkeling over a staggering reef. After lunch on board the boat, snorkel at the German Channel in the afternoon before returning to the resort for free time.

Day 8

JELLYFISH LAKE

Hike a forest trail to reach the secluded Jellyfish Lake for a surreal, once-in-a-lifetime swim. Drift among countless golden jellyfish as they pulse gently in the sunlit, green water – an experience of pure tranquility. Afterward, view an enormous disk of ancient Yapese stone money and snorkel over massive 500-pound giant clams. Visit the Belau National Museum to gather in a traditionally carved meeting house, where a revered elder shares the deep history and creation stories of the Palauan people. Celebrate your marine odyssey with a farewell dinner at the resort, toasting the memories of the archipelago.

Belau National Museum Visit **Koror**

After free time at the resort, transfer to Belau National Museum to hear the story of Palau from one of the elders.

Jellyfish Lake and Ngermeaus Island **Koror**

Start the day with a boat ride to the floating docks at Jellyfish Lake. From there, enjoy a short hike and swim to view the jellyfish. Afterwards, transfer by boat to snorkel over giant clams before enjoying a final lunch on the beach before returning to the resort for free time

Farewell Dinner in Koror **Koror**

Conclude the journey with a Farewell Dinner at the resort.

Day 9

KOROR

Your expedition to Palau concludes today. After breakfast, take a final look at the pristine waters before your individual transfer to the airport, provided at any time during the day.

Departure Day

Not ready to leave? Your Expedition Leader can help with travel arrangements to extend your adventure.

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What are the main highlights of this trip?

Plant young farmed clams on the reef to help restore the native population, Drift past sharks and turtles on a sheer wall known as the "Underwater Serengeti," Snorkel the haunting remains of a Japanese fighter plane resting on the shallow reef, Float among golden jellyfish in a silent and secluded marine lake, Hear Palau's deep history directly from a revered elder at the National Museum.

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Is there a disclaimer I should read before booking this trip?

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Is there an itinerary Disclaimer?

While it is our intention to adhere to the route described below, there is a certain amount of flexibility built into the itinerary and on occasion it may be necessary, or desirable to make alterations. The itinerary is brief, as we never know exactly where our journey will take us. Due to our style of travel and the regions we visit, travel can be unpredictable. The Trip Details document is a general guide to the tour and region and any mention of specific destinations or wildlife is by no means a guarantee that they will be visited or encountered. Aboard expedition trips visits to research stations depend on final permission.

Additionally, any travel times listed are approximations only and subject to vary due to local circumstances.

What is the group leader like?

All National Geographic Signature group trips are accompanied by one of our National Geographic Expedition Leaders throughout. The aim of the Expedition Leaders is to take the hassle out of your travels and to help you have the best trip possible. They will provide information on the places you are travelling through, offer suggestions for things to do and see, recommend great local eating venues and introduce you to our local friends. While not being guides in the traditional sense you can expect them to have a broad general knowledge of the countries visited on the trip, including historical, cultural, religious and social aspects. We also use local guides where we think more specific knowledge will add to the enjoyment of the places we are visiting- we think it's the best of both worlds.

How large will the group be?

Max 22, avg. 18.

What meals are included in this trip?

8 breakfasts, 7 lunches, 5 dinners

What are the modes of transportation on my trip?

Boat, Walking, Kayak, Private Vehicle.

Is there an extra cost for travelling solo?

Yes, for those travelling solo there is a single supplement.

What are the joining instructions?

For details of your joining hotel please refer to your tour voucher, G Account, the G Adventures App or contact your travel agent.

An arrival transfer is included when you arrive on Day 1, or if you arrive up to three days prior provided that you have booked your pre-accommodation through National Geographic Signature Journey in our joining hotel. Due to customer experience and quality considerations, all services related to the tour must be continuous.

Our driver will be waiting for you with a National Geographic Signature Journeys sign, and they will be waiting for you outside the luggage hall. If for any reason you are not met at the airport, please call our local support line. If you are unable to make contact for whatever reason, please make your way to the joining point hotel via taxi.

Please note that day 1 is an arrival day and no activities have been planned on this day.

Upon arrival to your Joining Hotel (note that check-in time will be in the afternoon), look for a note or bulletin board in the reception with a note from your National Geographic Expedition Leader. This note will give the details of your Welcome Meeting on day 2 (in the morning), where you will get a chance to meet your leader and other travellers, as well as learn more about how the tour will run. If you don't see a note, please ask reception for details!

What happens if I experience problems when arriving?

We don't expect any problems, and nor should you, but if for any reason you are unable to commence your trip as scheduled, please refer to the emergency contact details provided in this dossier and contact us as soon as possible. If you have a pre-booked transfer, and you have not made contact with our representative within 30 minutes of clearing customs and immigration, we recommend that you make your own way to the Starting Point hotel, following the Joining Instructions. Please apply to your travel agent on your return for a refund of the transfer cost if this occurs.

Who should I contact in case of an emergency?

Should you need to contact G Adventures during a situation of dire need, it is best to first call our local office in Melbourne. If for any reason you do not receive an immediate answer, please leave a detailed message and contact information, so we may return your call and assist you as soon as possible.

AIRPORT TRANSFER

If you have purchased an arrival through G Adventures or if an arrival transfer is included in the cost of your tour, please note that:

Your arrival transfer has been arranged based on flight information provided to us. Included arrival transfers are provided from the nearest airport to your starting location. If you are advised of a flight schedule change or flight cancellation within 48 hours of your scheduled arrival time, please call the emergency contact number to advise of your new arrival flight information. If you do not, we will not be able to rearrange your arrival transfer and you will need to make your own way to the starting hotel at your own expense. If your arrival transfer does not arrive within 30 minutes after you have exited the arrivals area please take a taxi to your start point hotel.

What instructions should I follow at the finishing point?

You will be met at your hotel and transferred to the airport at the end of your adventure.

What should be on my packing list?

Documents:

- Flight info (required) (Printouts of e-tickets may be required at the border)
- Insurance info (required) (With photocopies)
- Passport (required) (With photocopies)
- Vouchers and pre-departure information (required)
- Visas or vaccination certificates (With photocopies)

- Headphones (Noise-cancelling recommended)
- Locks for bags
- Long pants/jeans

- Reef-safe sunscreen

- Water gear (Two sets of swimwear, a long-sleeved rash guard (for sun protection while snorkeling), and a dry bag for electronics.)

What are the visas and entry requirements for my trip?

All countries require a valid passport (with a minimum 6 months validity). Contact your local embassy or consulate for the most up-to-date visa requirements, or see your travel agent. It is your own responsibility to have the correct travel documentation. Visa requirements for your trip will vary depending on where you are from and where you are going. We keep the following information up to date as far as possible, but rules do change and sometimes without warning. While we provide the following information in good faith, it is vital that you check the information yourself and understand that you are fully responsible for your own visa requirements.

How much spending money do I need for my trip?

Every traveller is different and therefore spending money requirements will vary. Some travellers may drink more than others while other travellers like to purchase more souvenirs than most. Please consider your own spending habits when it comes to allowing for drinks, shopping and tipping. Please also remember the following specific recommendations when planning your trip.

How much emergency money should I bring on this trip?

Please also make sure you have access to at least an additional USD \$200 (or equivalent) as an 'emergency' fund, to be used when circumstances outside our control (ex. a natural disaster) require a change to our planned route. This is a rare occurrence!

Should I be tipping on my trip?

On our National Geographic Signature tours, tipping is included for all included activities and meals, and portage. Tipping is not included for the Expedition Leader. Should you want some basic guidelines on tipping for the activities you do on your own, please see below. At the end of each trip if you felt your National Geographic Signature Expedition Leader did an outstanding job, tipping is appreciated. The amount is entirely a personal preference, however as a guideline would be \$10-\$15 per person per day.

For meals and activities not included in your itinerary, it is appropriate in Palau to tip 10%. Though not compulsory, tipping is expected. Although it may not be customary to you, it is of considerable significance to the people who will take care of you during your travels and shows an expression of satisfaction.

In addition, please note that tipping is not required or expected for the Expedition Expert.

What activities are optional on this trip?

Are there any health considerations I should know before travelling?

We recommend you contact your family physician, or your local travel clinic for the most up-to-date health information at least one month before departure. Travellers should also carry a basic first-aid kit and hand sanitizers/antibacterial wipes on their travels. Medical facilities are basic throughout these countries. For your own safety, we strongly recommend that you advise your tour leader of any medical condition that may affect you while travelling with the group. Your tour leader will be able to inform you of local health advisories (e.g. drinking water quality). Please ensure you have all the inoculations recommended by your doctor.

What do I need to know to about safety and security on my trip?

Many national governments provide a regularly updated advice service on safety issues involved with international travel. We recommend that you check your government's advice for their latest travel information before departure. We strongly recommend the use of a neck wallet or money belt while travelling, for the safe keeping of your passport, air tickets, travellers' cheques, cash and other valuable items. Leave your valuable jewellery at home - you won't need it while travelling. Many of the hotels we use have safety deposit boxes, which is the most secure way of storing your valuables. A lock is recommended for securing your luggage. When travelling on a group trip, please note that your group leader has the authority to amend or cancel any part of the trip itinerary if it deemed necessary, due to safety concerns. Your Expedition Leader will accompany you on all included activities. During your trip you will have some free time to pursue your own interests, relax and take it easy and explore at your leisure. While your Expedition Leader will assist you with options available in a given location, please note that any optional activities you undertake are not part of your itinerary, and we offer no representations about the safety of the activity or the standard of the operators running them. Please use your own good judgement when selecting an activity in your free time. Although the cities visited on tour are generally safe during the day, there can be risks to wandering throughout any major city at night. It is our recommendation to stay in small groups and to take taxis to and from restaurants, or during night time excursions. Water based activities have an element of danger and excitement built into them. We recommend only participating in water based activities when accompanied by a guide(s). We make every reasonable effort to ensure the fun and adventurous element of any water based activities (in countries with varying degrees of operating standards), have a balanced approach to safety. It is our policy not to allow our Expedition Leaders to make arrangements on your behalf for water based activities that are not accompanied by guide(s). Swimming, including snorkeling, is always at your own risk. [Read more about travel safety](#) for ways to further enhance your personal safety while traveling.

What rules should I know before joining this trip?

Illegal drugs will not be tolerated on any trips. Possessing or using drugs not only contravenes the laws of the land but also puts the rest of the group at risk. Smoking marijuana and opium is a part of local culture in some parts of the world but is not acceptable for our travellers. Our philosophy of travel is one of respect towards everyone we encounter and in particular the local people who make the world the special place it is. The exploitation of people in the sex trade is completely contrary to this philosophy. Your Expedition Leaders have the right to expel any member of the group if drugs are found in their possession or if they utilize the services of paid sex workers, in any capacity.

Is travel insurance required for my trip?

Travel insurance is compulsory in order to participate on any of our trips. When travelling on a group trip, you will not be permitted to join the group until evidence of travel insurance has been sighted by your leader, who will take note of your insurance details. When selecting a travel insurance policy we require that at a minimum you are covered for medical expenses including emergency evacuation and repatriation. A minimum coverage of USD200,000 is required. We strongly recommend that the policy also covers personal liability, cancellation, curtailment and loss of luggage and personal effects. Some tours include adventure activities that require extra coverage (e.g. crampon use); please review your itinerary and make sure that you are covered for all included activities. If you have credit card insurance we require proof of purchase of the trip (a receipt of credit card statement) with a credit card in your name. Contact your bank for details of their participating insurer, the level of coverage and emergency contact telephone number.
