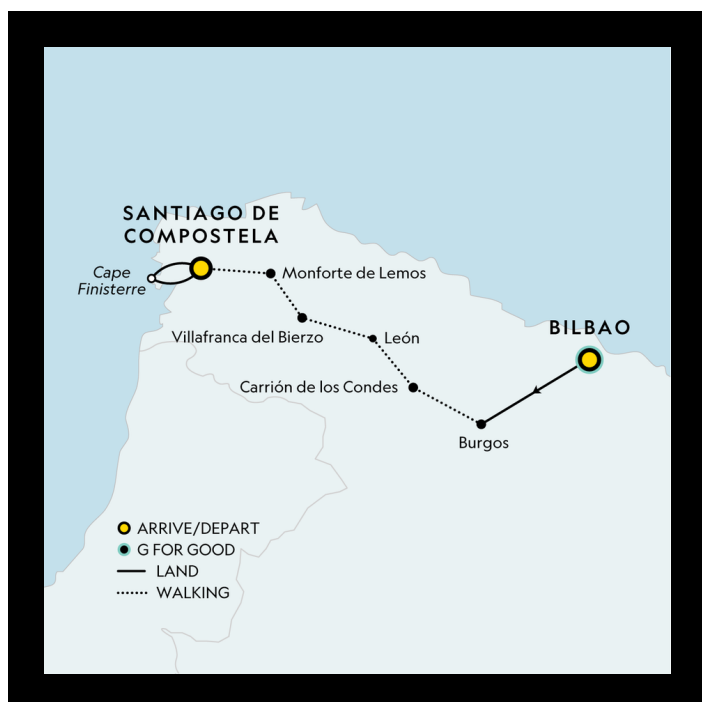

BILBAO

Welcome to the Basque Country. Your expedition begins in Bilbao, a city that seamlessly blends avant-garde design with deep-rooted tradition. You are met and transferred to your hotel to settle in before heading to a local community social enterprise. Here, join your National Geographic Expedition Leader, National Geographic Expedition Expert for a presentation illuminating the history and cultural significance of the pilgrimage ahead. After, gather with your fellow travellers for a welcome dinner, marking the start of your Spanish exploration with a celebration of vibrant Basque flavours and local hospitality.

You will be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel to start your adventure.

ACTIVITY

Your opportunity to meet your Expedition Leader and fellow travellers, and learn more about your tour. Don't forget to see the notice in the lobby (or ask reception) for the official time and place to meet up with the group.

ACTIVITY

Enjoy a welcome reception at Guruzu. This venue demonstrates how a high-end restaurant can function as a tool for labor insertion and community cohesion. By the end of the session, you understand Guruzu not as a soup kitchen, but as a professional, sustainable business where "every story counts" and where the simple act of sharing a table becomes a political and social act of equality.

Begin the morning with an orientation walk through Bilbao's main highlights, culminating at the iconic Guggenheim Museum for a private guided tour of its contemporary masterpieces. Later, leave the city behind and travel into the heart of the La Rioja wine region. In the charming town of Haro, inhale the scent of aging oak as you visit a renowned winery for a guided tour of its historic vineyards and cellars. Enjoy a curated wine tasting followed by a delicious local lunch before continuing your journey to the historic city of Burgos, where the evening is yours to explore at your own pace.

Please be aware that the timing of your Guggenheim Museum experience may vary throughout the day depending on seasonality and ticket availability.

Orientation Walk of Bilbao

Bilbao

2h

This Expedition Leader led walking tour is a narrative of survival and metamorphosis. By connecting the aristocratic Gran Vía to the medieval Siete Calles and finally the futuristic Guggenheim, you witness how Bilbao successfully pivoted from a gritty industrial port to a global cultural capital without losing its soul. It is a walk through time where every bridge and cathedral stone tells a story of Basque resilience.

Guided Tour of Guggenheim Museum

Bilbao

Discover the icon that transformed the art world with a curated guided tour of the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao. This architectural deep-dive explores Frank Gehry's titanium-clad genius, from the monumental outdoor sculptures to the soaring, light-filled atrium.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

ACTIVITY

A private wine tasting and family-style lunch at CVNE (Compañía Vinícola del Norte de España) is widely considered the "holy grail" of Riojaan wine tourism. The whole experience is an immersion into a winemaking dynasty. By dining in one of their historic rooms, you are stepping out of the modern world and into a space where time is measured in decades, not minutes.

Haro – Burgos

1h15m

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

The Camino begins in Itero de la Vega and continues onto Frómista, where the rhythm of the trail asserts itself almost immediately – a steady, meditative pace across la Meseta, the vast central plateau that has tested and transformed pilgrims for centuries. The landscape here is austere and quietly beautiful, the horizon impossibly wide. Pass the ancient Roman fountain at Boadilla del Campo and follow the serene waters of the Canal of Castile, an 18th-century feat of engineering that still carries boats through the breadth of the plateau. The day's walking spans four hours of ancestral path before arriving in Carrión de los Condes, where a night within the thick stone walls of a historic monastery provides a shelter as old as the pilgrimage itself.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Hike Itero de la Vega - Frómista

Itero de la Vega – Frómista

4h-4h

The hike from Puente Fitero to Frómista is a low-impact, high-reward stage. With a negligible elevation gain of only 45 meters, it is a day defined by horizontal beauty. By trading the wide-open, silent horizons of the wheat fields for the cool, shaded corridor of the 18th-century canal, you experience a literal and metaphorical "flow" that serves as a perfect physical recovery after the previous days of climbing.

Villalcázar de Sirga – Carrión de los Condes

15m

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Set off from the medieval city of Sahagún, heading west through the quiet village of Bercianos del Real Camino. After a three-hour hike, drive to the elegant city of León. After lunch in town, spend the afternoon with a local guide discovering the city's historic treasures, standing in awe before the remarkable cathedral and its gallery of over 100 luminous stained-glass windows. The city's pulse is vibrant yet grounded in antiquity. This evening, enjoy time on your own before retreating to a spectacular Renaissance convent, where the grand architecture provides a serene backdrop for your overnight stay.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Hike Sahagún to Bercianos del Real Camino

Sahagún – Bercianos del Real Camino

3h-3h

The hike from Sahagún to Bercianos is a symbolic milestone on the Camino Francés. Stop at the Santuario de la Virgen Peregrina, a 13th-century Mudéjar-style former Franciscan convent. The 2.5-hour walk is gentle, rhythmic, and shaded by plane trees, allowing you to arrive in the historic village of Bercianos with plenty of energy.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Guided Tour of Leon

Leon

1h-1h

This walking tour is a narrative of the "Kingdom of Light." By pairing the Romanesque depth of San Isidoro with the Gothic weightlessness of the Cathedral, you visit the two pillars of Leonese identity. Afterwards, walk to the Barrio Húmedo (the old tavern district), just steps from the Cathedral, for an included traditional lunch.

Day 5

LEON/VILAFRANCA DEL BIERZO

Your morning hike begins at a storied Roman bridge in Hospital de Órbigo. Follow winding country roads to El Crucero de Santo Toribio, a stone cross that has guided pilgrims for centuries, offering sweeping views of the trail. In Astorga, enjoy a well-deserved lunch at a local institution before exploring the town's eclectic architecture, from Gothic churches to a palace designed by Antoni Gaudí. Continue west into the lush landscapes of Villafranca del Bierzo. Meet a local guide for an afternoon walk through the town's historic streets before gathering for a group dinner to share stories of the day's five-hour trek.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Hike Hospital de Órbigo to Crucero de Santo Toribio

Hospital de Órbigo - Crucero

4h-4h

The hike replaces the flat horizons of the previous days with a series of "mini-peaks" and valleys that test your climbing legs. By starting at the monumental bridge of Hospital de Órbigo and finishing at the vantage point of Santo Toribio, you experience the Camino's transition from medieval history to the rugged natural beauty of the Leonine mountains.

Lunch at La Peseta in Crucero

Crucero

Lunch at La Peseta is not just a meal; it is a culinary rite of passage for anyone arriving in Astorga. After the dusty, undulating "rollers" from the Crucero de Santo Toribio, stepping into this wood-paneled institution feels like being welcomed into the dining room of a very wealthy, very talented Spanish grandmother.

Guided Tour of Villafranca del Bierzo

Villafranca del Bierzo

1h30m-1h30m

Enjoy a locally guided walk through Villafranca del Bierzo. This is an exploration of what locals proudly call "Little Santiago." The town is the final major stop in the province of León before pilgrims face the grueling climb into Galicia, and its architecture reflects its historical role as a sanctuary of both physical and spiritual refuge.

Galicia announces itself with hills rolling in deep, saturated green. The walking trail narrows into forest paths and ancient switchbacks, past thatched stone houses and villages seemingly unchanged for centuries. The ascent to O Cebreiro rewards with one of the Camino's most affecting sights: the oldest intact church on the route, its interior worn smooth by generations of pilgrims. Descend toward the 6th-century Samos Monastery — one of the oldest in the western world — its vast, silent cloister a reminder of the spiritual ambition that has shaped this landscape for fifteen centuries. The night is spent within the walls of a Benedictine monastery in Monforte de Lemos.

The hike from Las Herrerías to O Cebreiro is the stuff of Camino legend. It is the shortest but most vertically challenging day on the French Way—a literal "stairway to heaven" that takes you from the deep green valleys of El Bierzo into the misty, Celtic peaks of Galicia.

Guided Visit Monastery of Samos

A visit to Samos is a plunge into deep time. From the 9th-century Mozarabic roots of the Cypress Chapel to the Gothic and Baroque grandeur of the cloisters, the monastery serves as a physical record of Galician resilience.

Private Vehicle

Samos – Monforte de Lemos

1h

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Travel to San Paio to begin the final leg of your journey toward Santiago. From the heights of Monte del Gozo, catch your first emotional glimpse of the cathedral's striking towers on the horizon. Walk into the heart of the city to Plaza do Obradoiro, the triumphant endpoint of the pilgrimage route. After an eight-mile hike, celebrate with a well-deserved local lunch in the bustling city centre. Check into your beautiful hotel to rest your legs and soak in the atmosphere of this holy city. The afternoon is yours to wander the medieval streets or simply watch the modern pilgrims arrive at the journey's end.

The Parador de Santiago de Compostela is one of the oldest and most luxurious hotels in Spain. It is in the Plaza del Obradoiro next to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela, one of the most visited cathedrals in the world, and has witnessed the passage of pilgrims over the centuries. It began as a Royal Hospital with the Catholic Monarchs to offer them shelter and today it's known as Hostal dos Reis Católicos. The historic building preserves the Plateresque façade on the outside, four cloisters, elegant corridors and hallways, spectacular rooms, and a museum in its interior. The Hotel has the largest collection of Madrid School paintings in the Paradors collection. In Santiago de Compostela alone, more than 140 works by artists including Martínez Novillo, Álvaro Delgado and Menchu Gal are on display. What's more, the Parador has a business centre with large-capacity, spacious rooms for holding corporate and private events and celebrations of all kinds; it is equipped with the best technology and services to guarantee their success.

Beyond the Camino de Santiago, the city offers visitors a multitude of options, such as walking routes to discover the monuments in its streets and squares, walks through its parks and gardens and, if you have time, excursions to explore the Galician estuaries.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Hike San Paio to Santiago de Compostela

San Paio – Santiago de Compostela

3h30m-4h

The hike from San Paio to Santiago is a victory walk. It replaces the rugged nature of the previous days with a choreographed urban arrival. With a modest 12.5 km distance and a final descent into the city, it is a stage defined not by the miles on your feet, but by the weight lifted from your shoulders as you finally set your pack down in the center of the Obradoiro.

Journey to the dramatic Atlantic coast to visit Cabo Fisterra and Muxia, the westernmost tip of Spain. For many, this "end of the world" is the true spiritual conclusion of the Camino. Walk to the lighthouse, feeling the ocean spray and the powerful energy of the cliffs before a local lunch in town. Return to Santiago for a calm afternoon of reflection. After a farewell dinner, experience a private night visit to the Cathedral of Santiago. Led by an art historian, explore the hushed, moonlit nave and learn the deep secrets of this Galician masterpiece in near-total silence.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Walk to Lighthouse Fisterra **Fisterra** 1h-1h

Enjoy a leisurely walk to the Lighthouse of Finisterre, known in Galician as Faro de Fisterra. This is an iconic 19th-century lighthouse located on Cape Finisterre in Galicia, Spain. Its name derives from the Latin *finis terrae*, meaning "end of the earth," as Romans believed it was the westernmost point of the known world.

Private Vehicle **Fisterra – Muxía** 45m

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Visit and Hike in Muxia **Muxía** 3h

Muxía reveals itself through a lens of raw intensity, a village where the power of the Atlantic meets a sense of profound, ancient peace. Embark on a walk toward the Santuario Virxe da Barca, a sanctuary perched at the ragged, salt-sprayed edge of the European continent. While Fisterra is often cast as the 'End of the World,' it is here in Muxía where the Atlantic reveals its true power against the jagged shoreline. Returning to the village, take a moment to absorb a setting defined by granite, ancient miracles, and the relentless rhythm of the Costa da Morte: the Coast of Death.

Private Vehicle **Muxía – Santiago de Compostela** 1h30m

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

ACTIVITY

A private after-hours tour with an ecclesiastical historian is a total immersion into the "Sacred Dark." You begin with the humanity of the Pórtico, move to the divine gold of the Altar Mayor, and finally ascend to the architectural mystery of the Triforium. By seeing the "superior parts," you gain a perspective of the Cathedral that 99% of visitors never witness—a view that connects the dust of the pilgrim's path with the soaring light of the Gothic and Romanesque heavens. You aren't just seeing the Cathedral; you are inhabiting and absorbing its living history from the ground to the heavens.

After a final breakfast in the heart of Galicia, take a moment to reflect on the miles walked and the ancient history witnessed. Your expedition to the Camino concludes today. You will be transferred to the airport for your flight home, carrying with you the spirit of the trail and the enduring memories of Spain's historic pilgrim path.

In addition to your primary luggage, you will also require a small day pack or shoulder bag. This smaller bag is essential for keeping your camera, water, and personal items close at hand during day walks, excursions, and daily explorations.

- Personal entertainment (Reading and writing materials, cards, music player, etc.)
- Reusable water bottle

- Sunglasses

What are the visas and entry requirements for my trip?

Securing the necessary visas and travel documentation is an essential step in preparing for your upcoming expedition, and remains the responsibility of each individual traveller. Entry requirements fluctuate depending on your nationality and destination; while we strive to provide the most current information, immigration regulations change frequently. We strongly advise verifying all entry protocols directly with the relevant embassy or consulate well in advance of your departure. Please also ensure your passport remains valid for at least six months beyond your scheduled departure date from the country.

Travelling in Europe has been simplified with the introduction of the Schengen visa. As a visitor to the Schengen area (Austria, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Greece, Norway, Denmark, Iceland, Portugal, Finland, Italy, Spain, France, Luxembourg, Sweden, Czech Republic, Hungary, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia and Switzerland) you will enjoy the many advantages of this unified visa system. Generally speaking with a Schengen visa, you may enter one Schengen country and travel freely throughout the Schengen region during the validity of your visa. There are limited border controls at Schengen borders, if any at all.

Please note that the UK and Ireland are NOT part of the Schengen agreement.

A Schengen visa is applied for at the Embassy or Consulate of the Schengen country in which you will be spending the most nights on your trip to the Schengen space. If you are only visiting one country on your trip then you apply for your visa at the Consulate of this Schengen country.

As of 2025, various European countries are introducing ETIAS travel authorisation as an entry requirement for visa-exempt nationals.

What should I consider when planning my personal expenses and discretionary spending for this itinerary?

Every traveller is different and therefore spending money requirements will vary. Some travellers may drink more than others while other travellers like to purchase more souvenirs than most. Please consider your own spending habits when it comes to allowing for drinks, shopping and tipping. Please also remember the following specific recommendations when planning your trip.

What should I know about currency, credit cards, and exchanging money while on this tour?

Credit cards and debit cards are very useful for cash advances. Visa cards are the most widely accepted cards. While ATMs are commonly available, there are no guarantees that your credit or debit cards will actually work. Check with your bank. You should be aware when purchasing products or services on a credit card, that a fee usually applies. Do not rely on credit or debit cards as your only source of money. A combination of Euros and cards is best. Always take more rather than less, as you don't want to spoil the trip by constantly feeling short of funds.

What emergency funds do I need access to on this trip?

While personal spending habits naturally vary, we recommend factoring in your individual preferences for shopping, tipping, and beverages to ensure a seamless experience. In addition to these day-to-day comforts, we kindly ask that you maintain access to a minimum of USD \$200 (or its equivalent) as a dedicated emergency fund; though exceptionally rare, unpredictable circumstances such as changing weather patterns or natural events may occasionally necessitate a shift from our planned route, and this reserve ensures we can navigate any path ahead with peace of mind.

What are the tipping guidelines for this trip?

To ensure a seamless and elevated experience throughout your National Geographic Signature departure, gratuities have been fully taken care of for all included meals, activities, and luggage portage.

On our National Geographic Signature tours, tipping is included for all included activities and meals, and portage. Tipping is not included for the Expedition Leader. Should you want some basic guidelines on tipping for the activities you do on your own, please see below. At the end of each trip if you felt your National Geographic Signature Expedition Leader did an outstanding job, tipping is appreciated. The amount is entirely a personal preference, however as a guideline would be \$10-\$15 per person per day. Tipping is neither required nor expected for your National Geographic Expedition Expert.

For the independent moments on your itinerary, tipping is generally not expected across Central Asia. However, should you wish to reward exceptional service during independent dining or activities, a modest gratuity of 3-5% is entirely appropriate and warmly received by local community members.

While local pharmacies along our route may stock familiar remedies, they are often produced under regional names, so we advise bringing the generic chemical name of any critical prescription. Before finalising your plans, please carefully review the itinerary and physical requirements to ensure your personal fitness aligns with our style of exploration. To safeguard the well-being of the group, we reserve the right to excuse any traveller from all or part of an itinerary if, in the professional judgment of our Expedition Leader, continuing would pose an undue risk to themselves or their fellow travellers.

What general safety tips and free-time guidelines should I follow?

To ensure your well-being and security throughout our explorations, we recommend consulting your home government's regularly updated international travel advisories prior to departure. For peace of mind while on the move, we strongly advise using a concealed neck wallet or money belt to secure your passport, travel documentation, and currency. We suggest leaving exceptional jewelry at home, as it is unnecessary for our style of travel; instead, make use of the safety deposit boxes available at most of our accommodations. Securing your luggage with a reliable lock is also highly recommended.

When travelling on a departure, your National Geographic Expedition Leader maintains the authority to modify or adapt any portion of the itinerary should environmental conditions or safety considerations require it.
