You will be met upon arrival and transferred to your hotel. Rest and recharge tonight, letting the ambient sounds of the city soothe you as you prepare for the captivating historical and cultural treasures that will unfold across the island in the days ahead.

You will be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel to start your adventure.

Next, dive into the sensory swirl of the capital. Board a motorized tuk tuk to rumble past colonial landmarks, vibrant markets, and the historic streets of Colombo Fort and Pettah beside a local historian. Inhale the aroma of toasted spices during a heritage lunch at the Dutch Hospital precinct. The afternoon brings a nostalgic spin through the city in beautifully restored vintage cars. Conclude the day watching the sky turn amber during sunset drinks overlooking the crashing ocean waves before your welcome dinner.

Colombo

Explore Colombo by tuk tuk and on foot through the historic Fort and Pettah districts with a local historian. Discover colonial landmarks and bustling markets before enjoying a traditional Sri Lankan lunch at the iconic Dutch Hospital.

Vintage Colombo City Tour

Colombo

Explore Colombo in beautifully restored vintage cars, stopping at two iconic landmarks as your local guide shares stories of the city's colonial heritage, culture, and history.

Leave the coast behind and head into the emerald heart of Sri Lanka's Cultural Triangle. Watch the urban bustle seamlessly dissolve into a canvas of rural countryside and swaying palms. En route, ascend a dramatic rock outcrop to reach the ancient Dambulla Cave Temple. Step into the cool, silent cavern shrines to marvel at centuries-old Buddha statues and intricate murals illuminated by soft light. After soaking in sweeping views of the plains, pause for a relaxed lunch at a tranquil lakeside restaurant. Arrive at your lodge nestled deep in the natural surroundings of Kandalama. Take the afternoon to unwind at leisure before gathering for a dinner overlooking the mirror-like lake.

Guests can discover absolute serenity at the Coco Spa with Ayurvedic rituals, play tennis, or unwind in one of three spectacular swimming pools, all while framed by forest vistas.

Dambulla Cave Temple Visit

Sigiriya

1h-1h30m

Visit the ancient Dambulla cave temples at one of the most well-preserved temple and cave sites in Sri Lanka. See Buddhist mural paintings that line the walls of the seventh-century caves as well as a collection of hundreds of statues of Buddha in different poses.

Greet the dawn with a choice, each offering a distinct perspective on this ancient wonder: ascend the sheer vertical walls of the Sigiriya Rock Fortress to marvel at ancient frescoes and summit views from above, or capture the immense scale of the dramatic citadel from below via a guided scenic drive. Mid-morning, connect with a vibrant community initiative at a women-led reed weaving project. Listen to the rhythmic rustle of natural materials as local artisans demonstrate their craft, sharing light refreshments and stories of empowerment. After an authentic Sri Lankan lunch, the low hum of a tuk tuk carries you through the ruins of Polonnaruwa. Explore UNESCO-listed temples and royal palaces as historical tales bring the stone to life, before returning to the resort to relax before dinner.

Sigiriya

Choose between two ways to experience the UNESCO-listed Sigiriya Rock Fortress: climb to the summit for breathtaking views and a closer look at the ancient royal citadel, or enjoy a scenic guided visit around the base without the climb. Both groups reunite afterward before continuing together to a G for Good project.

Polonnaruwa by Tuk Tuk

Polonnaruwa

Explore the UNESCO-listed ancient city of Polonnaruwa by tuk tuk, visiting impressive royal palaces, temples, and iconic statues of the Lord Buddha. Discover the rich history, Buddhist heritage, and remarkable engineering of Sri Lanka's medieval capital.

Weaving Ancient Heritage

Sigiriya

Visit a women-led reed weaving project in a local village to learn about traditional craftsmanship and the role it plays in supporting local livelihoods. Meet the artisans, try your hand at weaving, and enjoy homemade Sri Lankan sweets and herbal tea.

Watch the lowlands dissolve into mist-shrouded peaks as you ascend into the lush highlands of Kandy. Arrive at the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic, where the air is thick with the scent of jasmine and burning incense. Witness the atmospheric puja ceremony, letting the rhythmic throb of traditional drums and low chanting anchor you in this deeply spiritual space. Afterward, enjoy a home-style lunch at a women-led social enterprise, a G Adventures-supported project, while connecting with local artisans. Continue your drive deeper into the mountains, where neat rows of emerald tea bushes carpet the hillsides like velvet. Arrive in Nuwara Eliya, a cool highland retreat wrapped in crisp mountain air and timeless charm.

Guests can pluck tea leaves in the emerald fields, dine inside a converted vintage railway carriage, or enjoy a mist-veiled spa treatment amidst the plantations.

Temple of the Sacred Tooth Tour

Enjoy a tour of the Temple of the Tooth, which houses an important relic – a tooth of Lord Buddha kept in a well-preserved golden casket. Learn about the importance of this site from local guides.

Social Enterprise Lunch

Kandy

Stop for a delicious traditional Sri Lankan lunch prepared by Sthree Craft Shop and Café. This social enterprise offers opportunities for local women and youth living with disabilities, through handicraft and hospitality training.

Settle in and scan the scenery from the convenience of a private vehicle.

Day 6

NUWARA ELIYA

Step into the dew-kissed fields of a historic tea estate, welcomed by a plantation specialist. Inhale the earthy fragrance of the highlands as you learn traditional plucking techniques, working alongside local workers to harvest the bright green leaves. Follow the harvest inside the factory, watching the processing from withering to grading, and learn how the global auction system functions. Next, participate in a curated tasting led by a tea expert, identifying subtle flavor profiles before enjoying a freshly brewed cup. Return to the hotel for a lunch overlooking the rolling estate and an elegant high tea.

Day 7

NUWARA ELIYA/YALA NATIONAL PARK

The whistle blows as you settle into your seats, watching the rugged peaks begin to roll past the window. Travel into a landscape of pure cinema. Peer out the window as the locomotive snakes past cascading waterfalls, deep gorges, and dramatic stone viaducts, cutting through rolling green hills wrapped in mountain mist. Disembark in the mountain town of Ella for a local lunch, then watch the scenery transform dramatically as you descend into the sun-drenched southern lowlands. Arrive at the edge of the wild savannah of Yala, checking into your lodge as the calls of the wild echo through the dry scrub and twilight settles over the wilderness.

Scenic Hill Country Train Journey

Ambewela – Ella

Travel through Sri Lanka's breathtaking Hill Country aboard one of the world's most scenic rail journeys, with reserved first-class seating. Admire sweeping tea plantations, cascading waterfalls, lush forests, and dramatic mountain landscapes during this unforgettable ride.

YALA NATIONAL PARK

Set out in the crisp pre-dawn light in an open-air safari vehicle, entering Yala National Park as the wild awakens. Scan the golden grasses and gnarled trees as park rangers track wildlife, offering deep insights into elephant behavior and ecosystem pressures. Return to the lodge for breakfast, followed by a private presentation on elephant conservation led by an active researcher. In the afternoon, head back into the bush for a second safari, observing how the changing light shifts animal movements around the watering holes. As evening falls, toast the day's discoveries with sundowners overlooking the wild landscape, followed by a dinner celebrating local flavors.

Yala National Park

Experience morning and afternoon safaris through Yala National Park with a local ranger. Explore the park by off-road vehicle in search of Sri Lanka's remarkable wildlife, including elephants, sloth bears, crocodiles, and the elusive leopard, with lunch included between safari drives.

One final morning safari offers a chance to catch the park's predators and birdlife active in the cool dawn air. After breakfast, swap your safari vehicle for a tuk tuk, rumbling along coastal lanes to a fragrant cinnamon estate. Watch a harvesting demonstration, learning the intricate art of peeling the bark, before enjoying a private lunch infused with local spices. Continue along the coast to the historic trading port of Galle. In the late afternoon, join your Expedition Leader for a walking tour of the massive Galle Fort. Walk the stone ramparts past the lighthouse and historic churches, before choosing to stay in the fort for dinner or returning to the hotel.

Travel by tuk tuk to a private cinnamon estate for an immersive experience celebrating Sri Lanka's renowned spice heritage. Enjoy a traditional estate lunch and a demonstration showcasing the art of cinnamon harvesting.

Galle Fort Walking Tour

Galle

Explore the UNESCO-listed Galle Fort on a guided walking tour through its historic streets, colonial landmarks, and centuries-old trading heritage. Discover highlights including the Lighthouse, Clock Tower, Dutch Hospital, and key religious sites while learning about ongoing conservation efforts. Guests can continue exploring Galle Fort at leisure afterward or return to the hotel.

Wake early for fresh pastries and coffee before transferring to the harbor. Board a private yacht for an exceptional ocean cruise alongside a Marine Biologist and National Geographic Explorer. Inhale the salty sea spray and enjoy breakfast and lunch on board while contributing to marine conservation fieldwork, scanning the deep blue waves for marine life. 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Is there a travel disclaimer for my itinerary I should review before booking this trip?

This compiled itinerary represents our thoughtfully designed plan, provided in good faith and correct at the time of publication. However, to ensure we deliver the most rewarding experience possible, our itineraries remain dynamic; we continuously refine our routes based on research, field insights, and guest feedback, meaning details may evolve between the release of our annual directory and your departure. What important notes should I be aware of before the trip?

1. Some culturally significant sights in Sri Lanka may not allow entry to people wearing hats or hijabs, or to those with covered faces. Examples of cultural sites with such restrictions may include, but are not limited to, the Sri Maha Bodhi Tree section or the Anuradhapura Cultural Site, the Dambulla Cave Temple and Temple of the Tooth in Kandy.
2. Displaying body art or wearing clothing that includes an image of the Buddha is illegal; please be culturally sensitive and respect the law and should you have any such tattoos, keep them covered at all times.
3. Traveling by road in Sri Lanka is certainly not what people are use to in Western countries. Many road ways are single lane, rules are not always followed, drivers appear to speed, do not stay in their lanes, and overtake in seemingly dangerous situations. Although their are some improvements in the works to the road infrastructure, there is a lot more to be done. As a result, some of the roads are poorly maintained, and this gets even more pronounced during and after the monsoon. As a result, travel time covering relatively short distances is very long in comparison to Western countries.
4. Please be aware that properties we stay in with only two stories may not have elevators installed and climbing the stairs with your luggage will be necessary.

What is the role of the group leader during this trip?

What details should I be aware of when planning my departure day?

What are the packing guidelines and luggage restrictions?

When deciding what to pack, considerations will vary based on your specific itinerary, the regions you are visiting, and the season in which you are travelling. Generally speaking, we recommend packing thoughtfully and keeping your luggage to one checked bag at a manageable weight to facilitate seamless transitions throughout your expedition.

In addition to your primary luggage, you will also require a small day pack or shoulder bag. This smaller bag is essential for keeping your camera, water, and personal items close at hand during day walks, excursions, and daily explorations.

To ensure your well-being and security throughout our explorations, we recommend consulting your home government's regularly updated international travel advisories prior to departure. We suggest leaving exceptional jewelry at home, as it is unnecessary for our style of travel; instead, make use of the safety deposit boxes available at most of our accommodations. Securing your luggage with a reliable lock is also highly recommended.

When packing try to pick loose, lightweight, long clothing that will keep you cool in the usually hot and humid climate of Asian summers. In predominately Buddhist, Hindu and Muslim countries we ask that you dress respectfully and avoid very short shorts/skirts and singlets/tanktops when visiting small rural communities or visiting temples or mosques or other holy sites as this may restrict your entry.
